Course Description: An analysis of managerial issues related to information technologies. Topics include information strategies, information systems methodologies, management of information resources, and management of innovation and change. *Prerequisites: BUS 3500 or ACC 3900 and admission to the MBA or MSNS-GIS degree program.*

- 1. Develop plans and budgets with attention to the rapidly changing area of information systems.
- 2. Examine the principles, practice, methodologies and terminology used in designing, developing and implementing information systems in organizations.
- 3. Analyze the impact of end-user computing on organizations.
- 4. Evaluate the current and future role of telecommunications in innovative global information systems.
- 5. Evaluate the role of information systems in obtaining an organizational competitive advantage.
- 6. Examine the role of Transaction Processing Systems, Office Automation Systems, Decision Support Systems, Expert Systems, and Executive Support Systems in an organization.
