The interdisciplinary Film Studies minor is devoted to the study of cinema history, theory, criticism, and production. The minor is comprised of two required film-centered courses and a core list of courses with film-specific content. Up to six hours of coursework in the film studies minor can be double-counted in a student's major. Students may also include Honors Program course equivalents. Existing prerequisites for all courses must be satisfied. Students may take no more than six hours in their major area(s) and no more than six hours elective courses in their major area(s).
