CHE Faculty and Alumni Establishes Counseling Award

Another wonderful achievement for this year is the establishment of the **Gloria Leitschuh Counseling Award**. Gloria Leitschuh, Ph. D. was a faculty in the Department of Counseling and Higher Education for 26 years, 1994 to 2020. She obtained a Doctorate in Counseling Psychology from the University of Illinois, Urbana Champaign, a master's in counseling and a bachelor's in psychology, both from Eastern Illinois University. Dr. Leitschuh taught Clinical Counseling courses including Basic skills, Diagnostics, Cross cultural counseling, and Practicum. She supervised interns and served as the coordinator of Practicum and Internship. She also taught at the Maastricht Center for Transatlantic Studies in the Netherlands.

Early in her career Dr. Leitschuh served as a leader for several alternative spring break trips throughout the United States. She was awarded numerous teaching and service awards during the course of her career. Her research interests included cross cultural counseling and women's issues. She loved teaching and was dedicated to her students and colleagues.

Dr. Leitschuh maintains a part time clinical practice as a psychologist.

The Gloria Leitschuh Counseling Award will support students in the Clinical Counseling program.

CHE Faculty Receives Lumpkin Foundation Grant!

The Lumpkin Family Foundation has provided a \$223, 280 grant to EIU's Department of Counseling and Higher Education to serve as community ambassadors bringing mental wellness and support toolkits, workshops, and resources to schools, businesses, and communities throughout Coles County. The grant also provided two graduate assistantship positions for the academic year and four in the summer.

The recipient, Dr. Danessa Carter and the graduate assistants (Madeline Hemrich and Payton Turk) will lead workshops for k-12 schools, places of employment, higher educational institutions, and various community centers (such as houses of worship) on how to identify early signs of mental illness and how to get the support needed. The purpose of the project, entitled *Reducing Stigma and Increasing Coping Skills in Central Illinois,* is to teach communities of individuals how to recognize their own need for mental wellness support and the self-advocacy tools needed to have their needs met, provide mental health and wellness toolkits for the region modified for varying audiences, and conduct a need-assessment of the region in tandem with program delivery to determine what additional future support might be needed by different segments of the population. This grant began in the summer of 2023 and will last through Summer 2025.

Applicants compete statewide at over 30 Illinois institutions. This year, three students in the Clinical Mental Health Counseling Program became a recipient of the DFI fellowship.
