CAMPUS SPOTLIGHT



Dr. **Daneen Deptula** is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychology. Professor Deptula earned her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology, specializing in child and family studies, from the University of Memphis in 2003. Prior to her position at Eastern Illinois University, Dr. Deptula completed a clinical internship at the Institute for Juvenile Research where she was involved in school-based interventions for ADHD and violence prevention. Her research has examined children's peer relations, including aspects such as aggression, bullying, friendships, and peer optimism. In collaboration with researchers at the University of Illinois-Chicago, Dr. Deptula has recently obtained funding from NIH for the study of family and peer influences on adolescent sexual behavior. Specifically, this research explores the effects of peer selection and socialization on subsequent high risk sexual behavior and drug and alcohol use. In addition, Dr. Deptula is investigating the direct effects of parent and family characteristics on individual attitudes and behaviors related to sex and the co-occurrence of sex and substance use. In 2006, Dr. Deptula published papers in the Journal of Positive Psychology and the Journal of Adolescent Health.

Dr. Charles Eberly is a Professor in the Department of Counseling and Student Development. Professor Eberly has a long-standing research interest in the American College Fraternity. He has been President of the Center for the Study of the College Fraternity from 1999-2005 and currently is a member of the board of directors. Dr. Eberly is also a Regional Director of the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators Knowledge Community on Men and Masculinities. Professor Eberly serves on the editorial board of *Oracle: The Research Journal of the Association of Fraternity Advisors* and *Journal of College Student Retention: Research, Theory & Practice.* His own recent publication record includes refereed papers in *Oracle* and in the *Illinois Counseling Association Journal.* On Eastern's campus, Dr. Eberly actively chairs master's theses (four completed in 2006) and serves as the Chapter Counselor to the Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity. The chapter has won a Buchanan Cup four times in six that it was eligible for recognition as one of the national fraternity's top chapters. Dr. Eberly's current research focuses on the value of faculty engagement in RSO's to reduce alcohol and violence issues.

Dr. **Eunseong Kim** has been an Assistant Professor in the department of Journalism at Eastern Illinois University since fall 2006. Her research focus is on the implications of new communication technologies on political and civic life and on journalism. She investigates the ways in which new information and communication technologies such as the Internet influence how political candidates conduct their campaigns, how voters understand and communicate their political concerns, and how political issues are deliberated in a society. Her background as a reporter and editor guides her other areas of research as well. She examines how new media technologies influence current and future journalists, journalism educators, and journalism audiences. She recently published an article investigating how web logs (blogs) influence the ways in which media relations officials conduct their work. Currently, she is preparing an article for publication examining the contribution of political blogs to online political discourse, while getting ready to launch a study examining the role of blogs and bloggers in traditional news media. Her new project will help us better understand how U.S. traditional media cope with new modes of communication and information, and how viable blogs are as sources of information.

Dr. Phil Age (School of Technology) and Professor Jean Dilworth (School of Family and Consumer Sciences) have collaborated on research since 2003. International corporations (Kodak, X-Rite, Lectra, Onyx, McDermid Autotype Ltd, and others) have supported their work with donations of equipment, software, and consumables valued at more than \$2 million. Age and Dilworth focus on digital color inkjet printing technologies. Their research has led to presentations, publications, and feature articles in professional journals. Both researchers are members of the Congress of Committees for Specialty Graphics Imaging Association (SGIA) for Digital Textile Committee and the Garment Decorator Committee. SGIA requested that they research the challenges of meeting fire codes for printed banners, signage, and display booths in places of public assembly. This research was published in the SGIA '06 Journal. During the summer of 2006, they completed research for a Minneapolis based corporation on colorfastness of UV colorants and coatings for outdoor textile signage. This corporation, including the UV ink manufacturer, used Age and Dilworth's research findings to improve their products. Age & Dilworth completed original research with seven international corporations on the colorfastness of direct-to-garment printed T-shirts. This research was presented to the American Association of Textile Chemists and Colorists in November 2006. Age & Dilworth were also selected by a premier multi-national distributor and fabricator of plastic sheet, rod, tube and film products to research their substrates and digital color inkjet printing for UV colorfastness. A premier artist and fine art printer (Gliceé prints enhanced with acrylic paints) is currently (February 2007) collaborating with Age & Dilworth on researching the best combination of inks and canvas for high-end art prints and UV resistance coatings. An additional three articles are in press with Fabric Graphics, a new trade journal.
