FY2007 COUNCIL ON FACULTY RESEARCH GRANT COMPETITION

The Council on Faculty Research Fall Competition funds projects for research and creative activity. Funds are available for commodities, contractual services, equipment, travel, and student help related to the project. No personal services dollars are available. All tenured/tenure track faculty in Bargaining Unit A and department chairs and associate chairs are eligible to submit in the Fall, 2006 competition. Beginning with awards made during the Fall, 2005 competition, any individual may receive only two consecutive Fall awards, after which the individual will be ineligible for a Fall award in the third year. Specifically, receipt of an award for the Fall 2005 and Fall 2006 competition will make an individual ineligible for an award in the Fall 2007 competition; eligibility will resume in the Fall of 2008 (FY2009). CAMPUS SPOTLIGHT



Dr. Debra A. Reid says that growing up on a farm in southern Illinois prepared her for her chosen profession - history. She worked at historic sites and open air museums in seven states before earning a Ph.D. in History from Texas A&M (2000). Since 1999 she has taught in the History Department at Eastern Illinois University. Recently Professor Reid has published several articles in museum publications such as, *Midwest Open Air Museums Magazine, ALHFAM Proceedings,* and *ALHFAM Bulletin.* She has also published in more traditional history journals including *Agricultural History* and the *Journal of Urban History.* Dr. Reid has a book in production at Texas A&M University Press [*Reaping a Greater Harvest: African Americans, the Extension Service, and Rural Reform in Jim Crow Texas* (anticipated spring 2007)]; and two articles nearing completion. She spent much of the summer of 2006 working on a proposal for her second book length study, *Tilling the Margins: Environmental Responsibility in the Racialized South,* and plans to pitch it to Louisiana State University Press.

Professor Vince Gutowski has taught in Eastern's department of Geography and Geology since 1983. His classroom teaching interests encompass a wide variety of courses in geology and geography. He has also been very active in leading field study courses to locations in the American west and southwest. Dr. Gutowski's conservation interests have had an impact on conservation along the Embarrass River, and he has served on the board of the Embarras River Management Association. Professor Gutowski's research has been communicated by many papers, posters, and presentations. The work has been funded by several agencies, including the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Department of Natural Resources. Most recently, Dr. Gutowski and his collaborators (including students) have used magnetic gradient surveys and ground penetrating radar for mapping suspected Anasazi ruins prior to archaeological excavation. This mapping led to identification of a pueblo with connecting rooms, several deep storage pits, and three burials. The work was funded by the Colorado Archeological Society and published in the program abstracts of the Geological Society of America.

Dr. Julie Chadd, assistant professor in the School of Technology, has recently conducted two research projects in collaboration with Dr. Karen Drage, also an assistant professor in the School of Technology. One project examined the impact the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) has had on high school career and technical education programs. The other examined the effect of NCLB on the grade level at which keyboarding is taught, as well as the techniques used to teach younger students. Both projects were funded by the Illinois University Council for Career and Technical Education. Preliminary results have been presented at conferences. Final results will be presented at the Delta Pi Epsilon National Conference and will appear in the conference *Edited Book of Readings*, as well as *Career and Technical Education Research*. Dr. Chadd has published past research in journals such as *Career and Technical Education Research* and has made several conference presentations. She has received internal funding from Eastern for upgrading the content and instructional equipment for several courses.

Dr. Jeffrey Michael Willardson was raised in a farming community in Northern Utah. He learned from an early age the value of hard work and completing projects. Dr. Willardson received a PhD from Arizona State University in Exercise and Wellness in 2005, and was honored with the outstanding graduating scholar award. Dr. Willardson has been on faculty in the Physical Education Department at Eastern Illinois University for 1 year. He has already published 14 research articles in peer-reviewed professional journals, which have included: *The Journal of Strength and Conditioning Research, The Journal of Sports Medicine and Physical Fitness*, and *Strength and Conditioning Journal*. His primary research interest is resistance training modalities for optimal athletic performance. Dr. Willardson enjoys getting students involved and helping them apply research in practical settings. His latest project is comparing failure versus non-failure resistance training with equal work on lower body muscular endurance, blood lactate and heart rate responses.
