## CAMPUS SPOTLIGHT



Dr. Richard Cavanaugh is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Health Studies, where he has taught since 1992. Dr. Cavanaugh received his Baccalaureate degree (History/Social Science) from Eastern Illinois University in 1972, his M.S. (Health Education) from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign in 1989, and his Ph.D. (Health Education) from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale in 2002. Dr. Cavanaugh's areas of teaching include school health education, safety and driver education, spiritual health, personal health, and first aid. In addition to teaching a wide variety of courses, Dr. Cavanaugh acts as the departmental advisor for teacher certification majors in health studies, a departmental assignment he has enjoyed since 1996. Dr. Cavanaugh's research interests include spiritual health, humor and health, as well as research that seeks answers to real world problems, particularly if it identifies needs related to health. For example, he and his colleague, Dr. Barb Walker, were awarded a CEPS telefund grant in 2005 to research spiritual attitudes and behaviors among college students, and a second telefund grant in 2006 that funded research on tanning bed usage among college students. Dr. Cavanaugh and Dr. Walker are co-recipients of a 2007 Illinois Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance (IAHPERD) mentor award at which the tanning research will be presented. Dr. Cavanaugh has presented at national conferences, most recently at the 2006 American School Health Association (ASHA) in St. Louis where he presented "The 'Good Humor' Teacher: Fostering Positive Humor Development" with colleagues, Dr. Kathy Phillips and Dr. Sheila Simons. Dr. Cavanaugh has recently developed a new course that was adopted in the general education curriculum at Eastern, HST 2200G - Health Citizenship. In 2006, Dr. Cavanaugh was awarded an Achievement & Contribution Award (ACA) in the category of teaching, and currently serves on the 2007 ACA Committee. Additionally, Dr. Cavanaugh serves on a variety of college and university committees, among them the Council on Teacher Education (COTE), Chair for 2007-2008, Eastern's Institutional Review Board, the College of Education and Professional Studies' Advisory Committee for Teacher Education (ACTE), and several departmental committees include the curriculum committee, the DAC review committee, and tenure-track search committee. Currently, he is also in his second three-year term serving on the CEAD council Board of Directors in Coles County.

Professor **Stephen J. Mullin** hails from La Jolla, California, and completed a Bachelor's of Arts in zoology at the University of California at Berkeley, a Master's of Science in zoology at the University of South Florida, and a Ph.D. in biology at the University of Memphis. He is presently an Associate Professor of Biological Sciences and teaches courses related to vertebrate biology, with a particular focus on herpetology. A behavioral and community ecologist, Professor Mullin's research interests focus on predator-prey relationships that involve different amphibian and reptile species. His research often has conservation implications and several projects have included collaborations with state agency biologists. Recent funding sources have included the Illinois Department of Natural Resources and the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service. Professor Mullin's lab features a mix of undergraduate and graduate students, and their publications have appeared in a variety of national and international journals. Professor Mullin received the Dean's Award for Research Excellence in 2007, and is currently editing a book on snake ecology and conservation to be published next year.

Dr. **Sam Guccione** is an Associate Professor in the School of Technology and Coordinator of the SOT Automation and Control Laboratory. He works with robotics, automated processes, industrial control computers, human machine interface in process control, machine vision, radio frequency identification (RFID), and industrial transaction databases. Dr. Guccione's research areas include exploring Industrial Ethernet's (IE) in production and manufacturing. This includes IE network security, integration of RFID within the IE, interactive web based access to industrial transaction databases in the IE, and how global positioning system (GPS) with RFID of automatic tracking of objects, vehicles, people, animals, etc. can be integrated into an IE.

Richard Robert Rossi is Director of Orchestral and Choral Activities at Eastern. Rossi did his DMA in conducting at the University of Illinois. In 1999, while at the University of Illinois, he was chosen as the most outstanding conducting student in America and was awarded the ALEX Award in the performing arts category from the National Alliance for Excellence from New Jersey. That same year Mr. Rossi was appointed as the conductor for the University of Illinois main stage opera production The Barber of Seville, one of several operas he has conducted in his career. Currently Professor Rossi directs the Eastern Symphony Orchestra. Eastern Symphony Chamber Orchestra, University Mixed Chorus, Concert Choir, and Oratorio Society. Mr. Rossi has been active in securing external funding for the Eastern Symphony Orchestra, having received significant support from the Charleston Area Charitable Foundation, individual donors from the community, and the Redden Fund. In addition to his work at EIU, Richard is also in his third season as the Chorus Director with the Illinois Symphony Orchestra in Springfield, Illinois where he has conducted the Fauré Requiem, Mozart Requiem and will be conducting this coming February the Duruflé Requiem in both Springfield and Bloomington, IL. Professor Rossi is also active as a composer of sacred and secular music. His compositions are published by G.I.A. Publishing based in Chicago.
