Dr. Simmons' one hour workshop on mindfulness	"Mindfulness and Interpersonal Neurobiology: The Self is Relational"  The emerging adult's (12 – 24 y/o) brain is going through tremendous changes that can fuel both creativity and risky behavior. Interpersonal neurobiology can increase our understanding of the emerging adult's brain, behavior and relationships. This experiential workshop will guide participants through a mindfulness unit developed to increase one's self-awareness.  Identify how brain development that occurs in emerging adults affect day to day functioning and decision making.

	Northern Illinois University all nicotine products included in smoke free campus; hosting BACCHUS Area 4 conference; perception of marijuana in res halls is permissive; NCHA data shows 10-15% students use pot in past 30 days; state slight increase
	Illinois State University lots of change with marijuana: legally always arrested for possession or consumption, deferral program good but not as effective as punitive charges
	Methodist College no issue with pot because nursing school rigor/clinicals; Code Blue poverty awareness campaign; self-health assessment to address anxiety; domestic violence in nursing school seems prevalent/significant – bystander intervention.
	Eureka College 650 students enrolled; transitioning provost back to faculty, Dean of Students left, now using interim – there's low incidence on campus so why need to address sex and pot issues??
	Lewis University most alcohol problems are drunks returning to campus
	Resurrection stress management getting involved with alcohol task force.
