Course description: This course is designed to introduce students to the fundamentals of

ballroom dance.

Course Objectives:

1. To acquire rhythmical movements common to different types of ballroom dance.

- 2. To acquire a variety of steps and patterns of movement for various styles of ballroom dancing.
- 3. To develop creativity in cooperative rhythmical ballroom dance patterns.
- 4. To develop satisfactory techniques of leading and/or following.
- 5. To learn proper social etiquette related to ballroom dance.

Assessment/Evaluation:

- 1. **Attendance and Participation—35%** Students must pass this portion of the course. Non-participation is equal to half an absence. Daily participation is required. (Final grades will be affected by absences as follows: 2=no grade change, 3=no grade higher than a B, 4=no grade higher than a C, 5=no grade higher than a D, 6=failure of the class.) If a student is more than 5 minutes late, the tardy will be counted as half an absence.
- 2. Written Tests—30%
- 3. **Skill Tests—35%** Level will be graded subjectively based on instructor's observation, skill tests on performance of steps, and possible peer ratings.

Course Requirements:

- 1. Attendance and participation are mandatory.
- 2. No heavy shoes or boots. Soft leather soled shoes, bare feet or socks should be worn.
- 3. No special clothing required. Please dress appropriately.
- 4. No gum, food or drinks allowed in the dance studio. Water bottles are acceptable.
- 5. No hats or caps may be worn during class.
- 6. Do not be late. (Remember: 2 tardies=1 absence.)
- 7. Turn off cell phone before entering classroom.

Emergency procedure: The class will either go to an inside hallway of McAfee in case of inclement weather or meet at the pavilion by the campus pond behind Lantz in case a campus emergency exists.
