KSS 3154 – Seminar in Sports Medicine Clinical VI

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Textbook: Principles of Athletic Training, 14 edition. W. Prentice – McGraw Hill.

Course Description: Practical experience in supervised clinical settings with an emphasis on the application of fundamental athletic training skills. This course will be taken concurrently with KSS 3144.

Objectives: At the end of the course the student will be able to:

1. Demonstrate an understanding of how to plan, design and evaluate athletic training room facilities
2. Establish appropriate budgets for various athletic training room settings (i.e. high school, collegiate, clinical)
3. Demonstrate appropriate techniques utilized for the employment process with prospective employers/employees
4. Design and implement emergency action plans for various athletic training settings
5. Demonstrate an understanding of the legal and ethical facets of the athletic training profession
6. Compare various insurance options available to both the general public as well as intercollegiate athletes
7. Demonstrate an understanding of current topics and trends associated with the athletic training profession

Requirements:

Skills: There are many new primary skills that have to be mastered in KSS – 3154 as well as secondary & tertiary skills that need to be refreshed. A clinical skill assessment packet covering these skills will be provided to you. Lab times will be utilized to learn and evaluate these skills. **YOU MUST SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE ALL SKILL REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO APPLYING THOSE SKILLS IN THE CLINICAL SETTING.**

Clinical: Student need to attain approximately *20 hours of weekly clinical experience in the EIU ATEP clinical sites.* **You are not to provide any treatment or rehabilitation until you have successfully completed the appropriate skill requirements and have permission of an ACI. You are not to evaluate, treat or provide advice to any athletes outside of**

the athletic training clinical site. Refer to clinical skill packet V for additional information regarding your clinical experience.
