**Class Description:** A general introduction to all aspects of theatre as a live performance and visual art. Outside viewing is required.

- 2- An understanding of theatre movements and key theatre artists
- 3- A basic understanding of the theatre ensemble: Playwright, Director, Designers, and Actors
- 4- The ability to analyze both theatre and drama.

## Conduct of the Course:

1. **Attendance** - Attendance at lectures is expected. You will be permitted three (3) unexcused absences without penalty. Tests and quizzes missed on days of unexcused absences cannot be made up unless I have been given prior notification. Absences for Approved University events and serious illnesses are excused. Students more than ten (10) minutes late will be considered absent. Students five (5) minutes late will be considered tardy. Two (2) tardies will count as one (1) unexcused absence.

Students will lose five (5) points from final grade average per absence over the allotted number (3)

2. **Performance attendance** – You are required to attend the University productions of “*A Strindberg Café*”, “*Almost Maine*” & “*A Christmas Carol*”. There will be a written assignment regarding each play. Each production will cost you only \$5 and are held in either of the two theatre spaces at The Doudna Fine Arts Center. It is wise to make reservations prior to attending as some shows have been known to sell out.

3. **Academic Accommodation** – If you have a documented disability and wish to receive academic accommodation, contact the Office of Disability Services at 581-6583.
4. **Cell Phones** – As noted earlier, please turn off all phone and electronic devices during this class as a courtesy to your fellow students and myself. This of course includes texting. Students caught texting will lose credit for that class period. Also, headphones and MP3 players are not allowed unless circumstances and myself allow it.

This policy also applies to any live performance you attend. It is extremely rude to use any sort of electronic device during a concert, play, or any other live performance.

5. **Reading** – Reading is due the day it appears on the syllabus and you need to have that play read by the time we convene for class. I've made reading for this class very light with only one play “*Oedipus the King*” (Gainor, Garner Jr. & Puchner, *Norton Anthology of Drama (Shorter Edition)* pg. 93). This play is not only important to the class, but also influential in more of our modern day culture than you may realize. Make sure you read the play, and read it on time.

6. **Paper Writing** – All papers submitted in this class must have 1.5 spacing and 1” margins on all sides. The font must be 12 point *Times New Roman*. Please see to it that your name appears on each page and that the pages are stapled together.

8. **Academic Integrity** – Committing plagiarism by copying the words or original ideas of another person without giving that person full and proper credit is an especially serious violation of the University academic dishonesty policy. If you violate this policy and are discovered you will be reported immediately for disciplinary action.

## Assignments

1. **Bio Project** – For the second day of class, you need to write a bio of yourself. The bio should be no more than half a page and should take no more than a minute to present to the class. Your bio should contain the following:
  - a. Your name
  - b. Where you are from
  - c. Your major & minor (if applicable)
  - d. Any theatrical experience you may have had
  - e. Something you enjoy (i.e. hobbies, sports, interests, etc...)
  - f. Organizations you belong to (if applicable)
2. **Reaction Paper** – The Reaction Paper is due after each of the three (3) departmental productions and should be two (2) to four (4) pages in length. Additionally, your paper must include your program and ticket stub attached to it as further proof of your attendance. Papers missing any of these elements will not be accepted resulting in a grade of “0” for the assignment. Late papers will have 5 points deducted per day late.

Reaction papers should thoughtfully discuss the play and critique the elements that comprise it (i.e. acting, directing, design elements). Your own opinion is what I’m looking for and you will not be penalized for negative views of the performances. What I’m really looking for is seeing that you put forth honest effort to discuss what you thought of the show and support those thoughts and opinions in an intelligent manner.

3. **Auditions** – To better appreciate one of the aspects of being an actor, you will be required to choose and memorize a short, one minute monologue to be delivered to the class.
4. **Group Project** – Because theatre is a collaborative art, you will have one group project to work on. Using “*Oedipus the King*”, you will choose a group that will put together a concept for a production. Details on this will be forthcoming
5. **Quizzes** - Three (3) quizzes will be given over the materials covered.
6. **Exams** – There will be a Midterm and Final Exam

## Extra Credit

Extra credit may be earned one of three (3) ways.

1. Audition for a production with the EIU Theatre Department. Five (5) points will be awarded for auditioning and an additional ten (10) points will be awarded for getting cast in and adequately fulfilling your responsibilities in the production.
2. Attending plays outside of EIU Theatre Department productions and all productions attended must be approved in advance. Only one (1) high school production may be attended for extra credit. To receive credit, you must turn in your program, ticket stub, and a short one-page summary of the production. The paper needs to have the same spacing and font as your assigned Reaction Papers. You will earn an additional five (5) points per production you attend on your final grade.
3. You may help out on a production here at EIU. Five (5) points per hour worked will be earned for up to a maximum of twenty-five (25) points total. A sheet obtained from me will be needed recording your hours and the signatures of crew heads who supervise you.

### OR

You may work on the running crew of a show working behind the scenes of a play which will give you firsthand experience of what goes into running an actual live theatrical play. This will involve coming to ALL tech rehearsals the week leading up to the performance as well as ALL performances of the show. Successful completion of this will earn you an additional twenty-five (25) points.
