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Course Description

Food production & food service sanitation & safety standards. Regulations for food service operations including food storage, food handling practices & food-borne illnesses.

Course Objectives

Documented Disability:

EXAM

There will be **75 questions** on the exam. **You MUST GET 75% correct** out of 75 questions. That means **you must have 56 questions correct in order to pass the exam and pass this class.**

IF YOU RECEIVE AN “F” ON THE EXAM, MEANING YOU FAILED THE TEST, THE “F” WILL BE RECORDED ON YOUR TRANSCRIPTS AND WILL NOT COME OFF; EVEN IF YOU RETAKE THE EXAM AGAIN AND PASS IT WITH AN “A”, THE “F” WILL REMAIN ON YOUR TRANSCRIPTS. WHEN YOU RETAKE THE EXAM AND PASS, IT WILL SHOW THAT YOU RETOOK THE EXAM AND PASSED.
