#### III. Reports

- A. Sue Songer
  - 1. Ms. Songer reported in Mr. Elliott's absence that OPT has been extended to 17 months for some students.

  - 3. Ms. Songer reported that Mr. Elliott will be going to Turkey in October to participate in a recruiting fair.

#### B. Marilyn Thomas

1. Ms. Thomas reported on two separate proposals regarding additional ways to meet the English language mastery requirement for International Student Admission Purposes. Ms. Thomas spoke on the EIKEN test and the Michigan English Language Assessment Battery (MELAB) test. After a brief discussion, a Motion to approve the proposals was made by Dr. Kopel and seconded by Dr. Coles. After further discussion and vote, the proposals were approved. # E. Dean Augustine
