Know Ye, That, in pursuance of the Acts of Congress
appropriating and granting Land to the late Army of the United States
passed on and since the sixth day of May, 1812, William Kelly,

having deposited in the General Land-Office a Warrant in his favour, numbered 5216.
there is granted unto the said William Kelly,))
late a Private in the Twenty Sixth Regiment of Infantry,

a certain Tract of Land, containing One hundred and Sixty Acres _____ being
the South East quarter of Section Ten _____ of Township Two south in Range Seven west in
the Tract appropriated (by the Acts aforesaid) for Military Reserves, in the Territory of Illinois :
To have and to hold the said quarter Section of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said William
Kelly _____ and to his heirs and assigns for
ever.

In Testimony whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal
of the General Land-Office to be hereunto affixed. Given under my Hand, at the City of
Washington, this Third — day of August, in the Year of our
Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen and of the Independence of the
