

Full Suffrage Here Seen as Blow to Foe

"If we can't have full measure of democracy here, we should not dare to speak of fighting for it abroad."

Dudley Field Malone, speaking at a luncheon given by Chicago members of the National Woman's party at the City club yesterday, in this sentence showed the significance of the fight made by the party for woman suffrage, the demand for which he declared was only a demand for democracy.

"We will win this war," assured the speaker. "With both our men and our women enfranchised, as they will be if the federal suffrage amendment passes the senate, we shall have an army that will smash the kaiser from behind as well as one that will smash him from in front. When the news that the American house and senate has enfranchised the women of America shall reach Germany and Austria, another terrible blow will be struck at Prussianism."
