

The Eastern Illinois University Laboratory School was organized as a "Model School" with the opening of the Normal School in Charleston in 1899. The first school consisted of four teachers for grades one through eight. During the first year of operation a ninth grade was added. This pattern was retained until 1913 when the ninth grade was dropped. Four years later, in 1917, the school was reorganized again with grades 7, 8, and 9 forming a junior high school. A year later a senior high school was organized.

In the fall of 1954, a plan was placed in operation which would result in a dual line of grades from grade one to nine. In the fall of 1958 this plan became operational with the addition of four and five year old kindergartens and a ninth grade.

The Laboratory School is housed in the Robert G. Buzzard building, named for Eastern's second president. This modern building, completed in 1958, is located on a ten-acre site with adequate physical education and play area. Cost of the building was \$1,840,000.00.

Purposes Of The School

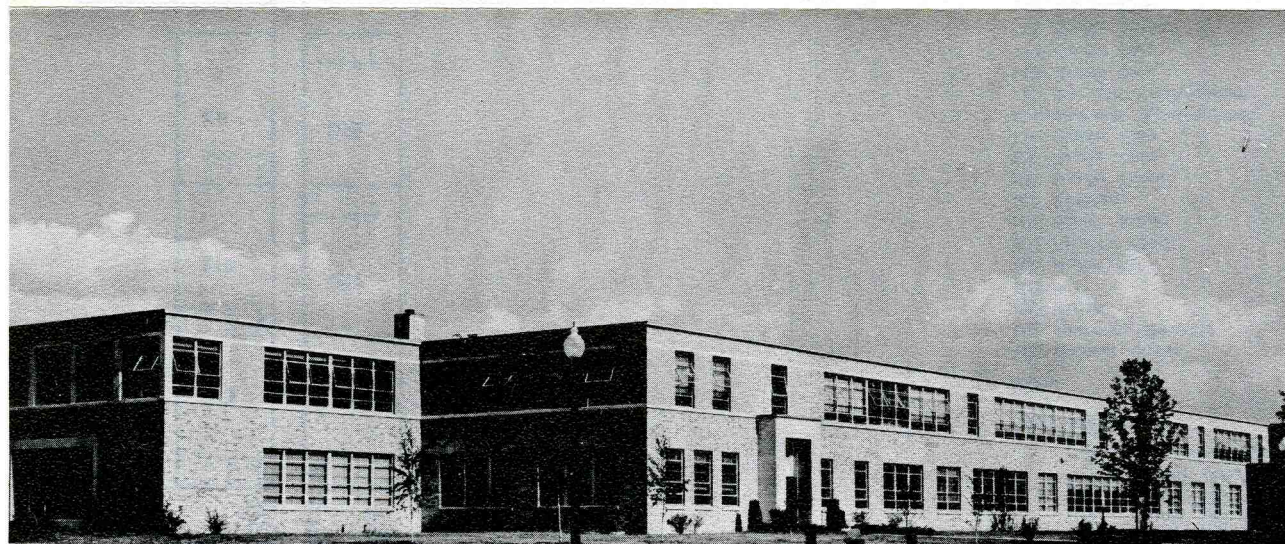
The Laboratory School at Eastern Illinois University serves three major functions: (a) provides a superior educational program for its pupils, (b) serves as a laboratory for the gathering of information and data significant for research in child growth and development, learning, and teaching methods (c) facilitates a program of teacher education by providing opportunities for student teachers and observers.

Admission To The School

When vacancies occur, admissions are made on the basis of application blanks filed with the school. The children of university faculty members and classified employees are given enrollment preference. With this exception, the school is open to the children of any resident of Illinois. Factors included in determining priority are: date of application, and whether there is reasonable expectancy that the child will remain in the laboratory school through the ninth grade. Applications far outnumber the number of vacancies occurring. It is wise to file your application as early as possible so that it may be a matter of record. Application forms are available in the assistant director's office.

NO TUITION OR ADMISSION FEE IS CHARGED BY THE LABORATORY SCHOOL.
STUDENTS PAY ONLY MINIMAL FEES FOR TEXTBOOK RENTAL AND CLASSROOM MATERIALS.

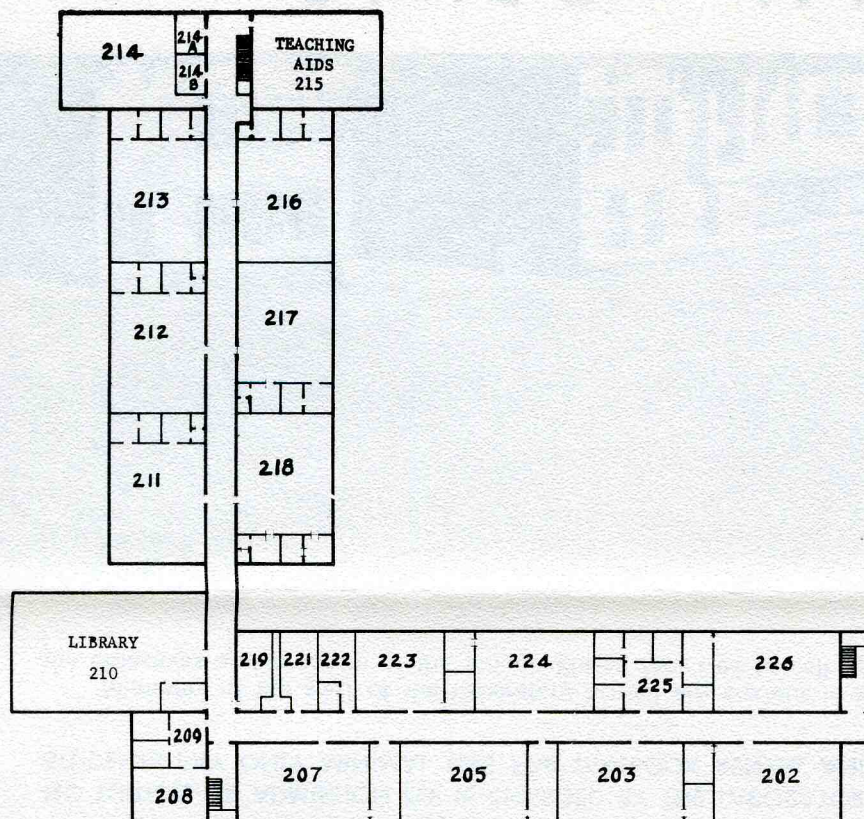
