Seventy-five Years of Excellence, 1899-1974

The "years of excellence" had its beginning at the turn of the century when an act of the Illinois Legislature created Eastern Illinois State Normal School. At the very beginning, in 1899, the curriculum plan for the Normal School included a "training department." The Legislative act stated the object of the school to be established at Charleston "Shall qualify teachers... by imparting instruction in the art of teaching in all branches of study..." President Livingston C. Lord was instrumental in editing a circular containing the statement: "The function of the State in education extends of necessity to the training of teachers."

The first "laboratory school," known in the early 1900's as the Model School, started in the Gothic style building popularly referred to as "Old Main." Enrollment in the first Model School was quite significant with a total of 159 pupils as compared to 208 in the Normal School student body.

The originally selected head or supervisor of the training department of the Model School, was Louis H. Galbreath who died before the school opened. Francis G. Blair, who had been selected to teach philosophy of education and applied psychology, was assigned to Galbreath's position. Mr. Blair held the position of the Model School supervisor for seven years when he resigned to become State Superintendent of Public Instruction, a position he held for twenty-eight years.

The history of the "school's excellence" is reflected, in retrospect, in the high ideals and learning values held by Mr. Lord and Mr. Blair and those who followed in leadership roles in the many facets of education of "training school" pupils and students seeking a career in teaching. Mr. Lord emphasized skill in teaching through practical discussions of the subject in teachers meetings and at chapel.

The daily "chapel" or morning exercises became a distinctive feature of the conduct of the Illinois Eastern State Normal School. The whole school attended, from the six-year olds of the first grade, (in little red chairs placed for them and other model school pupils before Mr. Lord and the faculty seated on the platform), to normal school students. A sixth grade teacher in the early Model School recalled Mr. Lord reading "Just So Stories" or children hearing a visiting celebrity talk. Whatever the chapel topic - psychology, teaching, behavior, personal experiences, music, anything, everything, was given with vigor, sincerity, and great relish. Not always did the children understand, but the chapel was something big and important—the whole educational scheme laid out before them. The custom of all pupils attending chapel continued to 1929.

In 1913 a new Model School Building (Blair Hall) was ready for use built at a cost of \$75,000. Along with the Normal School, the Model School achieved distinction and prestige. As the school gained national recognition, it was appropriate that the school name became in 1921 "Eastern Illinois State Teachers College at Charleston."

Following the death of Mr. Lord in 1933, Dr. Robert G. Buzzard became the college's second president. Dr. Buzzard's contribution to the school was his determination that Eastern should keep in step with the development of modern education. In a report to the State Superintendent in 1934, President Buzzard stated the building needs of the school. One of the needs as stated was a "modern training school unit to demonstrate current teaching on the pre-school and kindergarten, elementary, junior high, and senior high school levels." Dr. Buzzard's twenty-five year building program of 1944-1969 included a training school to provide improved facilities for all twelve grades as well as a pre-school and a kindergarten. The new building was planned to include an auditorium, a pool, and "two" gymnasiums. Dr. Buzzard pointed out in 1948 that practice teaching was the very heart of the teacher-education program and existing facilities hampered both practice teachers and 450 training school students. In a sense the training school was an orphan child on a college campus. Funding for a training school gave way to a greater urgency of the building of Booth Library.

As the college enrollment increased with many returning veterans, shifts in classroom use was necessary. The elementary grades moved to a Quonset building and Dr. Art Edwards was principal of the elementary division. The high school which had existed since 1918 was closed in 1955.


It soon became evident that Dr. Buzzard's dream for a training school would become reality. Definite plans began to materialize for a building and for the legislature to appropriate funds to construct an educational plant if Eastern was to attain the highest measure of efficiency and meet the demand of Illinois schools for professional trained teachers. Dr. Harry Merigis, a graduate of Oklahoma University, arrived on campus in 1954. It was not long before Dr. Merigis began to have a professional input in the planning fathered by Dr. Buzzard for a unique school and organization to enhance the teacher training program at Eastern. In the fall of 1958 a \$1,840,000 Laboratory School was ready for operation. The new plan called for a dual line of grades from the four and five year old kindergarten through grade nine. The new enrollment was approximately five hundred pupils. The new laboratory school faculty and facilities were called on to offer innumerable services to the college departments and the college community in east central Illinois.

Dr. Buzzard, who had faithfully followed the progress of the Laboratory School resigned in 1956. The third president of the college was Dr. Quincy Doudna and during his administration the college was renamed Eastern Illinois University. Dr. Donald Gill became principal of the school in 1960. With a dedicated and professional staff, the laboratory school experimented with modern approaches and techniques in learning. A Humanities Curriculum in the Junior High School was extremely provocative and challenging, utilizing the talents of the gamut of faculty and pupil interest. Keeping abreast of a national trend, the school began a program of "Individually guided Education," better known as "clustering," a term unique to the laboratory school for the purpose of goal accomplishments in the program.

During the seventy-five years of excellence of the training, or the model, or the laboratory school, there has been a nostalgic pride, honor, and respect carried by the alumni who have gone on to seek their fortunes in life. Although the function of the present Laboratory School comes to a close in May, 1974, the inherited memories and its many accomplishments have and will influence the lives and actions of many individuals associated with the school. It would be most appropriate that "excellence" be etched on a memorial epitaph of the Robert G. Buzzard Laboratory School, Eastern Illinois University.
