Artists in Bloom (ages 4-6)

Designed for young children, this class will introduce the elements of art through lessons in a variety of 2-D and 3-D media. The class will also reinforce the proper use of various art tools, such as scissors and paintbrushes, through a series of fun, exploratory projects.

Animal Totem Clay Masks (ages 10 and over)

Instructor: Karen Reed

Thursday, February 23, 6:30-8:30pm; Saturday, February 25 12:00-4:30pm

Fee: \$52.00 for Tarble members, \$65.00 for non-members

This workshop focuses on the creation of a clay mask inspired by Native American art forms. After an introduction to animal totems and masking traditions, participants will design and create a mask using slab and appliqué techniques. Surface decoration in the form of scraffito and engobes for colorants will also be explored.

The Figure in Mixed Media (ages 15 and over)

Designed for beginners and advanced participants alike, students will experiment with a variety of drawing and painting materials and techniques to create mixed media figurative works. Participants may focus on portraiture, the whole figure, or both.

Mosaic Furniture (ages 15 and over)

(Note: Class participants will need to supply their own small wooden piece of furniture, such as an end table.)

Using shards of china, this workshop will introduce participants to the pique assiette form of mosaic applied to a small piece of furniture. Topics to be covered include design options, how to safely break the china, applying the shards, and grouting to complete the mosaic furniture.

Self-Expression Through Collage (ages 15 and over)

Self-expression and creativity are a universal function of the human psyche. In this class, students will express themselves through the creation of collages by utilizing multiple media and images. Participants will analyze an experience, either personal or cultural, and formulate an image that expresses a unique and creative vision. Students will also learn how to utilize a grid in order to create a concrete structure for the image.

The Reincarnated Paintbrush: Introduction to Assemblage

Fee: \$60.00 for Tarble members, \$75.00 for non-members

Assemblage is the technique of creating 3-D art from found objects. In this workshop, participants will transform an ordinary, old, worn-out paintbrush into a figurative assemblage sculpture by using various found objects, paint, and tools to shape features. Students are asked to bring an old house-painting brush at least 3-6" wide and one old baby doll head of similar width, and any other found objects they may wish to bring.

Class registrations are taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Small class sizes ensure ample one-on-one instruction.

Cancellation and Refund Policy: The Tarble Arts Center has the option of canceling a class or workshop if there are fewer than the minimum number of students required. If the Tarble Arts Center cancels a class due to insufficient enrollment, the class fee will be refunded. A student withdrawing from a class after enrolling must notify the Tarble Arts Center on or before the registration deadline to receive a full class refund. Because classes are funded on a break-even basis, no refunds will be made for withdrawals after the registration deadline.
