Final exam will be to collect news related to teaching throughout the semester and to write a paper about the news and how it will impact the profession of teaching and/or your content area.
- g. Complete 20 hours of pre-clinical observation *arranged through the student teaching department*. Write two reflections on the observation hours from the topics provided.
- h. Complete a group service learning project.
