SUMMER 2011 ART SCHOOL

July 10-16

The Eastern Illinois University Department of Art and the School of Continuing Education is working cooperatively with the Illinois Federation of Women's Clubs to present the 2011 Summer Art School for High School students. The areas of concentration for the 2011 program include:

▲ exploring media in drawing Students will experiment with a variety of drawing materials including charcoal, graphite, hard pastel, inks and watercolors. Several drawings will be created with subjects ranging from still life material to portraits. A final project will focus on interior space using choice materials.

INSTRUCTOR - Natalie Boyer - Ms. Boyer has a BA and MA in drawing and painting from EIU, along with an MFA from Indiana State University. This is Natalie's third time teaching drawing for the Art School. She is a regular teacher for the Tarble Art Center's classes. She has shown her paintings in numerous venues.

▲ color monotypes, abstractions from life

Students will experiment with the monotype process and color theory by creating color monotypes based on drawings of chosen objects.

INSTRUCTOR - Reagan S. Carey - Ms. Carey is a traditionally trained figurative artist who holds a BA in Two-Dimensional Studio Art and a Masters of Art from Eastern Illinois University. She enjoys spending time with her husband and their two children. She is currently employed at CTF where she has served adults with developmental disabilities for the past ten years.

▲ altered books Students will use discarded hard-bound books and transform them into sculptures using the techniques/media of pop-ups, pockets, photo transfer, soft-cut printmaking, sketching, and watercolor. Learn various book structures to subtract and add to the original discarded book. These sculptural books become living sketchbooks during our week in the studio.

INSTRUCTOR - Jamie S. Willis - Ms. Willis is a Middle School Art Teacher, she has taught at EIU Art School throughout the past years. She has been awarded Middle Level Art Educator of the Year and Illinois Art Teacher of the Year by the Illinois Art Education Association. She is a Watercolorist and Fiber Artist.

▲ sculpture Students will be introduced to modeling and mold making techniques, using clay and wax. They will then cold cast a plaster sculpture.

INSTRUCTOR - Dorothy Bennett - Ms. Bennett has been teaching at the Art School for 18 years, and this will be her 5th year as director. She has a BA and MA in metalsmithing and sculpture from EIU, and has taught K-college. She currently teaches at EIU. She has twice been named the Illinois Elementary Art Teacher of the Year, and received the Distinguished Service to the Profession of Art Education award from the Illinois Art Education Association. She was also awarded the 2008 Distinguished Educator Award from EIU's Alumni Association.

applicants will

have the opportunity to focus on 3 of 4 areas of concentration during the week-long experience and must indicate their ranked preferences on the registration form. The objective of the School is to introduce students to new techniques and help students refine their aesthetic skills. Participants will be expected to commit themselves to a demanding course of study and development. There will also be a variety of recreational activities planned and students will have time to relax, make new friends, and experience campus life.

special saturday morning workshop

Rocky Maffit will be presenting a Saturday morning workshop where the students will be introduced to musical sounds and rhythms from around the world as performed by acclaimed percussionist, Rocky Maffit. This will be a unique opportunity to participate in a variety of 4th dimensional/time arts activities that are becoming more popular in the art world as exemplified by groups such as Blue Man Crew and Stomp.

about the faculty and art facilities:

The faculty of the 2011 Summer Art School consists of professional artists and art educators with well-regarded regional and/or national reputations. The faculty are selected because of their expertise in the specific areas of concentration. Students will utilize college art classrooms, studios, and other related art instructional facilities. Classes will be held in the new Doudna Fine Arts Center. In addition, students will have the opportunity to view and critique original works of art exhibited in the Tarble Arts Center, an art facility which features traveling exhibitions by nationally known artists.

location

The Summer Art School is held at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, Illinois. Charleston is located in East-Central Illinois, just off I-57 on Route 16. It is 135 miles from St. Louis, 200 miles from Chicago, and 120 miles from Indianapolis.

camp schedule

Summer Art School will run from July 10-16, 2011. Registration and check-in will be held in the lobby of the assigned residence hall from 2:00-4:30 p.m. on Sunday, July 10. (All participants will receive an acknowledgement letter with directions and a campus map.) On the last day of the program (Saturday) there will be a reception and an exhibition showcasing the work of the students. Parents and family members are invited to attend. Participants will depart after the exhibition.

registration fee

The tuition for the 2011 Summer Art School is \$460.00, which includes all instruction, six nights lodging, 18 meals in a University residence hall, recreational activities, also included is a \$49.00 non-refundable art materials fee. Please enclose with your application a \$50.00 deposit from you or your sponsor, which will be applied toward your tuition. The application and deposit are due by May 27, 2011. The remaining balance of \$410.00 is due by June 10, 2011. Enrollment is limited. Apply early to ensure a place in the camp.

cancellation policy

If you register and find you cannot attend, a full refund less the \$49.00 non-refundable art materials fee will be made to you or your sponsor if you cancel by June 10, 2011. Thereafter, an additional cancellation fee of \$50.00 will be retained.

scholarships

A variety of civic groups provide scholarships to talented students who might not otherwise attend. Check with your art teacher, counselor, or high school principal to see if any organizations in your community offer such assistance. Students may receive full or partial scholarships for their registration fees. However, students do not need to have a scholarship to attend. The partnership with the GFWC Illinois Federation of Women's Clubs has resulted in the sponsoring of thousands of high school students to the Summer Art Schools since 1948. accommodations and meals

EIU's south quad residence hall complex will be available for your stay. The residence halls are modern, air-conditioned complexes with double occupancy rooms and public lounges. The first meal served will be dinner on Sunday evening and the final meal will be lunch on Saturday. Individuals with special dietary restrictions are urged to make special note of those needs on the registration form so that accommodations can be arranged well in advance.

recreation

Several activities and services are available to participants. All activities are located on the campus. During free time, participants will be able to use some University sports facilities. Participants should bring their own equipment including balls, bats, racquets, etc. These are a few of the available activities: swimming, racquetball, football, soccer, basketball, pool, tennis, bowling*, softball, volleyball, theater* and video games*. (*These activities will involve a small extra charge.)

campus rules

All students will be supervised by staff counselors while in the residence halls, and will be expected to follow EIU policies at all times. The Art School will be run "closed campus" and participants may leave the grounds of the University only with written permission from a parent or guardian and consent from a member of the Summer Art School staff.
