Title of Lesson: Monet's Japanese Bridge

**Grade Level:** 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade

## **Objectives:**

- 1. Students will become familiar with the work of Claude Monet and the Impressionist style of painting.
- 2. Students will create their own painting based on *The Japanese Bridge* by Claude Monet.

## **Materials:**

white paper crayons brushes pencil watercolor paint water

## **Procedure:**

- 1. The teacher will introduce some of Claude Monet's work through the Internet or prints on the board. The teacher's examples will also be displayed.
- 2. The teacher will discuss with the class the subject matter of the painting. The students may create their painting any way just as long as it includes a bridge, trees or bushes, body of water (pond or river), and a sky.
- 3. The teacher will demonstrate the Impressionist style of painting technique, using quick brush strokes.
- 4. White paper is distributed.
- 5. Students will begin by drawing a bridge. The bridge will be drawn in pencil first, then traced over (heavily) in crayon.
- 6. Watercolor paints, brushes, and water are placed on each table.
- 7. When the bridge is finished, students will begin painting trees or bushes, body of water (pond or river), and a sky. They will paint using the Impressionist style (quick brush strokes). Students can paint directly on top of the bridge since it is a wax resist.
- 8. Clean up The finished paintings will be placed in the drying rack.

9. The finished works can be displayed.

## **Evaluation:**

- 1. Did students paint using the Impressionist style (quick brush strokes) of Painting?
- 2. Were students able to explain how their work relates to that of Claude Monet?
