Kindergarten Symbols

A symbol is a shape or a color that means something more! Kindergarten students identify two curved chalk lines . . . "It's a heart!" Students explain what the shape means . . . "Love! Valentine's Day!" Students observe red, pink & purple papers. Colors can be symbols, too! Symbols are used to represent ideas & feelings. They can be associated with seasons or holiday celebrations. Shapes & Colors are part of the Language of Art-Design Elements (IL State Standard 25). Celebrations with symbols reflect culture/society. (IL State Standard 27). How can we make art with symbols? One way is to make a collage! (IL State Standard 26).



Fold a paper in half.



Make half a heart with a chalk line.



Cut on the line to practice.



Put glue on only 1 side. Do you see the 7? Press the halves together.




Now you are ready to stick the heart on larger paper.

Would you like to use a fancy white paper doily? Can you use your scraps to make something new? Make some hearts without a chalk line! Fold & cut.
