Student will create a group of images that will tell a visual story by layering the images by way of translucent surfaces. Example would be a background image created by choice of media on appropriate surface with main subject over-laid on top with graphite, charcoal, or ink on vellum.

Mixed Media - Graphite, Charcoal, Ink, Acrylic, Watercolor, Colored Pencil, etc.

Support Surfaces for media choices

Vellum

Presentation/Mat board

Instructions:

- Planning and Research
- Decide on subject for foreground to be reinforced with second layer as background.
 - Example: Face of fisherman drawn on vellum with abandoned fishing boat on separate surface behind man with fogged look through vellum.
- Media will determine materials.
- Color palette needs to convey mood.
- Demo media as needed.
- Class critique.
- Presentation
