Students wishing to pursue the BFA with option in Studio Art may apply for admission after earning a total of 45 semester hours of credit, complete the foundations program (Art 1000, 1001, 1110, 1111) six semester hours of (Art 2012, 2601, or 2602) and six semester hours of 2000 level studio courses (Art 2000, 2050, 2100, 2250, 2560, or 2700), have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 for all coursework, and a minimum Studio Art GPA of 2.75, submit an electronic portfolio of artwork completed in foundations studio courses and 2000 level studio courses, and a one-page statement of intent. The portfolio of artwork will be reviewed and ranked by the Studio Area faculty. Admission in the program is based on a comparative scoring system of performance in the above requirements (cumulative GPA, Studio Art GPA, completion of required coursework, portfolio of artwork, statement of intent).

### LAPTOP COMPUTER REQUIREMENTS STUDENTS ENTERING FALL 2019

A personal computer is and will continue to be an important part of the educational experience. A student will need to have access to personal computer technologies as he or she moves through his or her educational experience at Eastern Illinois University. In some cases the personal computer may not be used in class but will be required to complete class assignments; in other instances the personal computer will be an integral part of the classroom experience.

All entering art majors are suggested to have an Apple laptop computer. The hardware requirements are subject to change each year as Apple develops and markets new laptop models.

#### Software requirements are:

Microsoft Office (student edition) and the Adobe Creative Cloud Design Standard (education version) (www.adobe.com). Adobe Creative Cloud Design Standard Collection is strongly recommended for students interested in the Graphic Design option. Students accepted into the Graphic Design program beginning their junior year would be expected to subscribe to the Adobe Creative Cloud (education version) at that time.

Before you purchase your computer and software for your college career, you should check the pricing available for computer and software bundles through the EIU Bookstore. Very reasonable pricing for software is often available. <sup>1</sup>GRADUATION REQUIREMENT FOR FOREIGN LANGUAGE (0-8 HOURS) The graduation requirement is successful completion of two courses in a single foreign language. Exemption: Students entering university FALL 93 and after must have completed two (2) years in a single Foreign Language in High School with a grade of "C" or better to have satisfied this requirement. Students exempt from Foreign Language would have 6 semester hours of free electives to complete for degree requirements.

<sup>2</sup>Students are required to complete a course with a focus on cultural diversity. Students can take one of several designated general education courses: see Gen. Ed. courses Listed by Segment in the Gen. Ed. section of the Undergraduate Catalog.

<sup>3</sup>30 semester hours of courses numbered 3000 or above must be taken from these courses to complete graduation requirement of at least 40 semester hours in upper division courses (3000-4000 numbered courses).

<sup>4</sup>Art 4749 is an audit only class with no credit earned; taken concurrently with upper level 3D Art Studio Elective during senior year.

<sup>5</sup>Credits count for both Art Studio option and General Education Fine Arts requirements.
