Suggested Curriculum for students using Regular Secondary Education Program (R)

Students Entering Fall 2010

Consult undergraduate catalog for academic regulations and requirements and undergraduate degree programs.

Students must receive a “C” or better in all art and professional education courses and maintain a minimum cumulative and major GPA of 3.0 in order to continue in the program.

¹Requires University Approval to Take Teacher Education Courses

²Teacher Certification candidates are required to take a 3 sem. hr. diversity course or third world/non-western culture course. Students need to confer with an academic advisor regarding which designated general education courses fulfill the requirement.

³GRADUATION REQUIREMENT FOR FOREIGN LANGUAGE (0-8 HOURS)

The graduation requirement is successful completion of two courses in a single foreign language. Exemption: Students entering university FALL 93 and after must have completed two (2) years in a single Foreign Language in High School with a grade of “C” or better to have satisfied this requirement. Students exempt from Foreign Language would have 8 semester hours of free electives to complete for degree requirements.

⁴The nine semester hours of art electives in a selected art medium should be taken from coursework in ceramics, drawing and painting, graphic design/electronic media, metalsmithing, printmaking, sculpture, or weaving.

⁵For students in the Art Education Option, the University Approval to Take Teacher Education Courses should occur no later than the first semester of the Junior year or the semester completing ART 2400. This will allow students planning to take the Regular Secondary Education Program to take EDP 3331 and SED 3330 the second semester of the Junior year and ART 3410/3415 the first semester of the Senior year. While the Regular Secondary Education Program is satisfactory for completing the professional education coursework the Art Department recommends students enroll in the Integrated Secondary Education Program (ISEP) to complete this requirement for teacher certification.

⁶Students may **enroll** in any undergraduate professional education course that includes a field experience or practicum **no more than twice**.
