

## Alumni Survey 2007, One Year Out (2006 graduates) Executive Summary of Qualitative Data

There were 846 alumni surveys returned out of 1907 reachable graduates<sup>1</sup> for a 44% return rate. The number of responses given below will not total 846 because some former students gave responses falling into more than one category and others chose not to respond to these questions. What follows are the number of alumni comments that fell into the various categories in response to the following questions: *What had the most positive impact on you during your time at Eastern?* (A total of 684 alumni responded to this question.) And, *What had the most negative impact on you during your time at Eastern?* (A total of 591 former students responded to this question.)

### What had the most *positive* impact on you during your time at Eastern?

Relationship with professors/advisors: 309 (45%)

Specific programs; coursework; scheduling; overall education: 242 (35%)

Student Life: 224 (33%)

Involvement/Activities/Recognized Student Organizations/Athletics: 59 (9%)

University-wide Issues: 103 (15%)

Facilities/Services/Community/Staff/Diversity: 67 (10%)

Personal Growth: 36 (5%)

### What had the most *negative* impact on you during your time at Eastern?

No response: 255  
Total responses: 591 (70% of returned survey respondents; 502 negative impact)  
Nothing negative: 89 (15%); 44 additional positive comments (7%)

Academics: 308 (52%)

Relationship with professors/advisors: 143 (24%)

Specific programs; coursework; scheduling; overall education: 165 (28%)

Student Life: 92 (16%)

Relationships/social activities/Greek System/Housing: 84 (14%)

Activities/Recognized Student Organizations/Athletics: 8 (1%)

University-wide Issues: 147 (25%)

Facilities/Services/Community/Staff/Diversity: 147 (25%)

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<sup>1</sup> There were 2,136 potential graduates in this cohort. A total of 229 graduates were unreachable because of bad addresses, were deceased, or had "do not solicit" orders. The above total reflects the number of alumni who received the survey.
