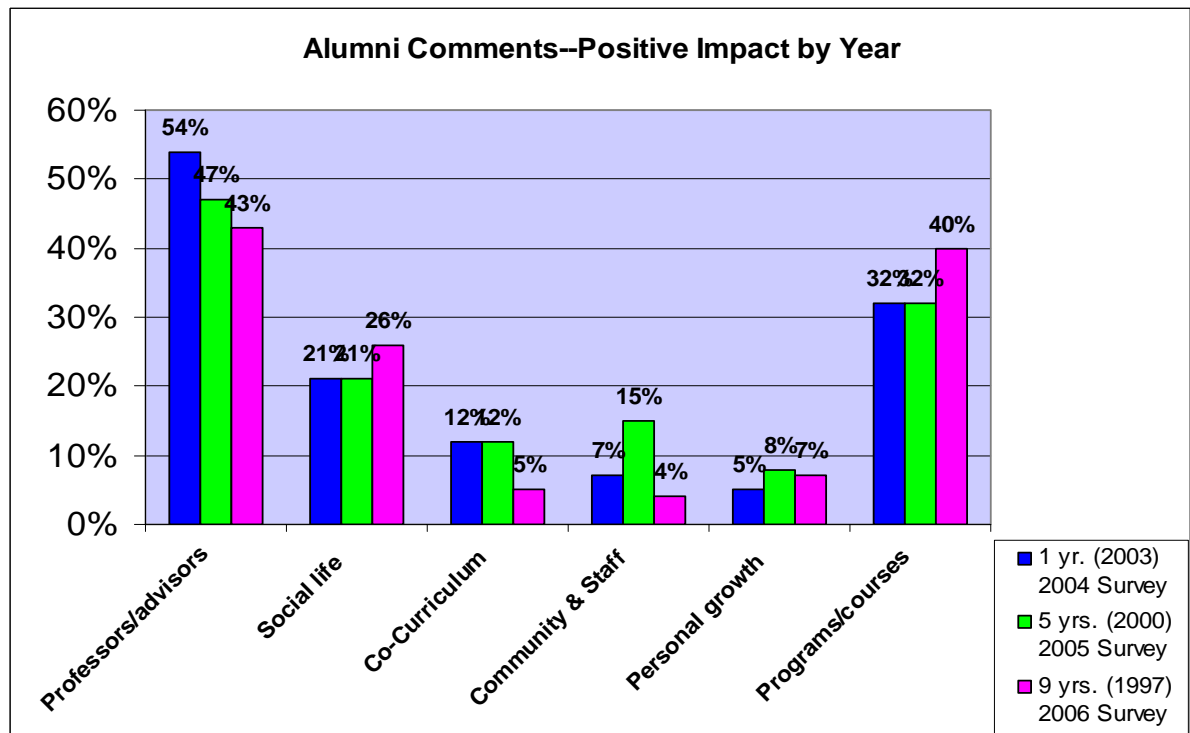


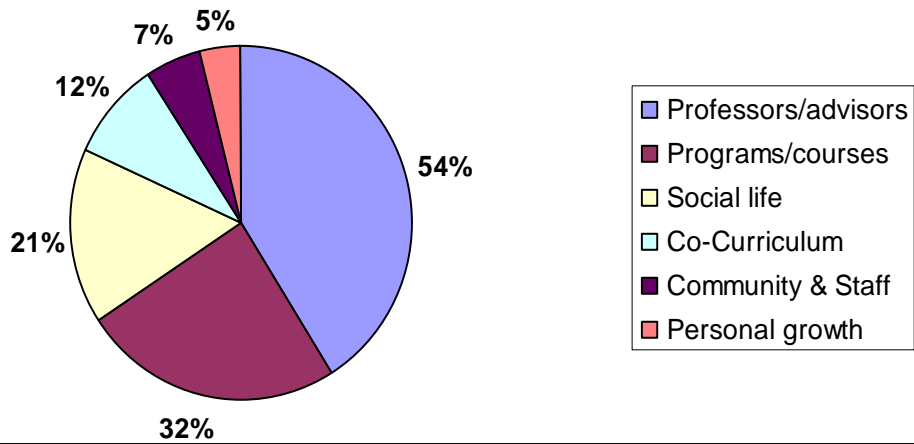
Comparisons of Qualitative Data from 2003-2006 Alumni Surveys

The following table illustrates the comment categories from the question, *What had the most positive impact on you during your time at Eastern?*

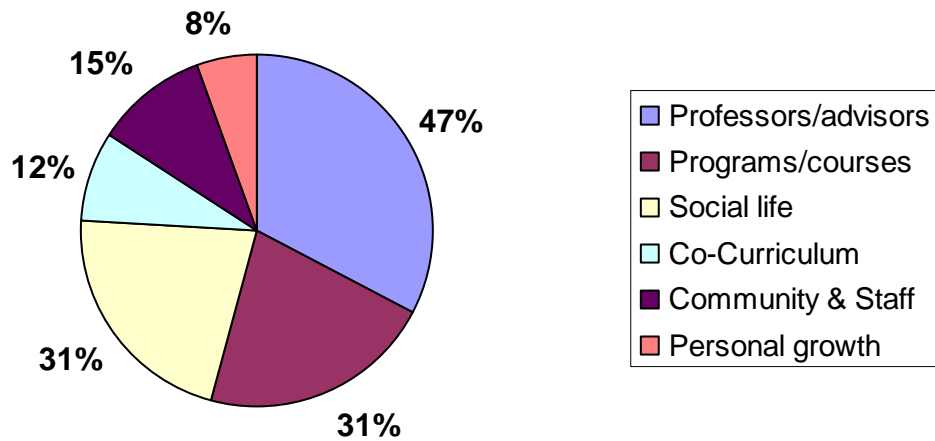

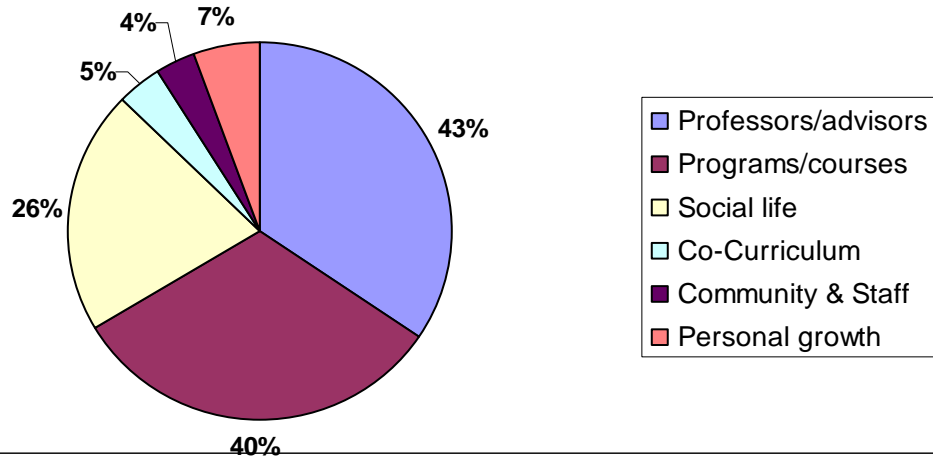

(2000 Graduates; 2005 Survey)**

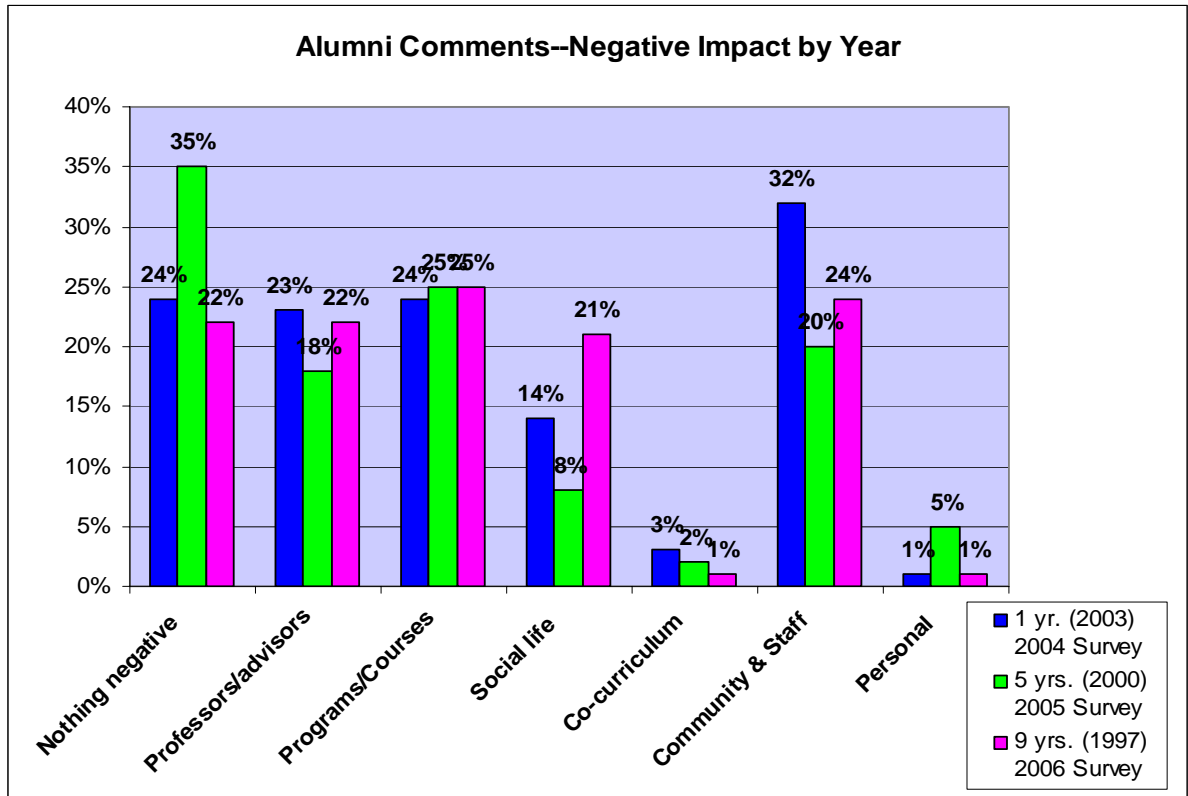


**Nine Years Out Alumni Survey Positive Comments

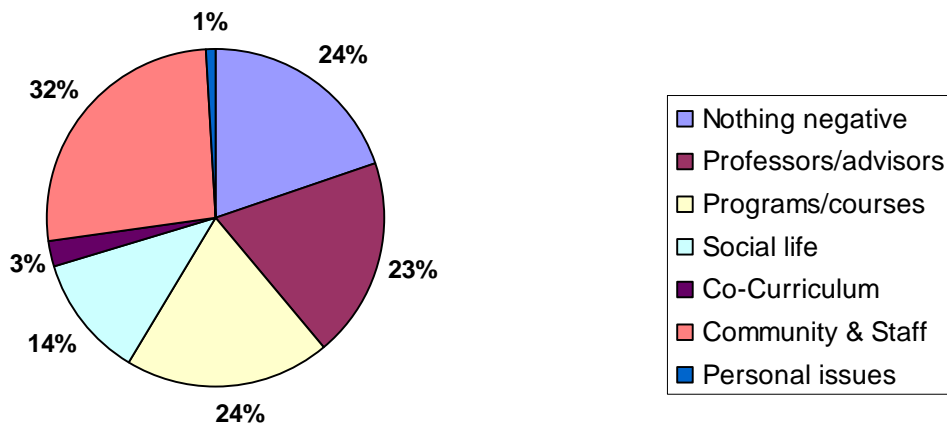

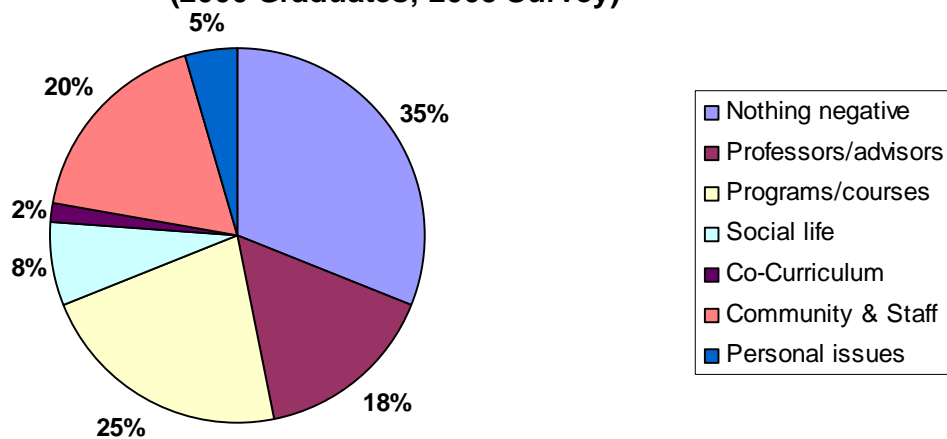

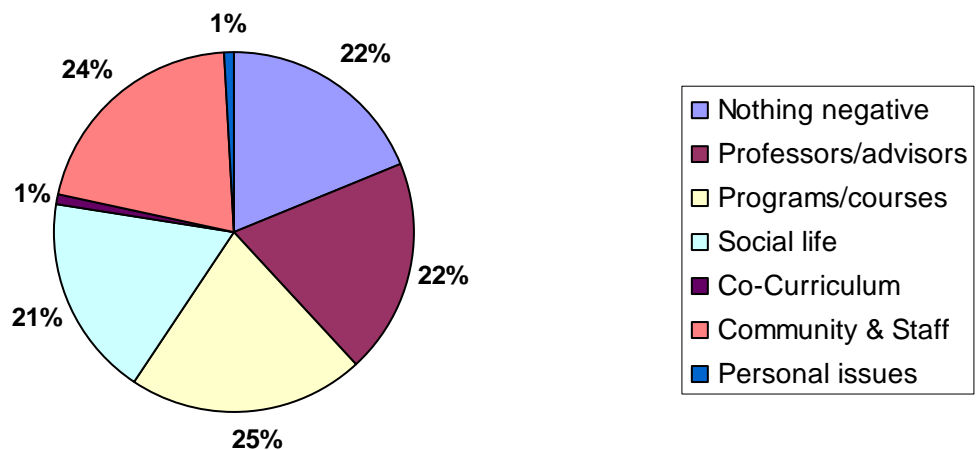
