

2008-2009 SOCIAL SCIENCE WRITING AWARDS EASTERN ILLINOIS UNIVERSITY

The Departments of Economics, History, Political Science, Psychology, and Sociology-Anthropology of Eastern Illinois University invite students to participate in the Annual Social Science Writing Awards competition. Regardless of major, undergraduate students who write research papers as a regular assignment in all social science courses may submit them for recognition and one of the cash awards.

Past Awards Have Ranged From \$50.00 to \$150.00

Participants are encouraged to revise papers before submitting them. Students need not be enrolled at EIU during the semester when the awards are made (that is, papers written Spring/Summer/Fall 2008 are also eligible).

CRITERIA FOR SELECTION

The Selection Committee requires double-spaced, typed papers that consistently follow a recognized style of documentation and prefers papers between eight and thirty pages. Winning papers will have the following qualities:

Precise and Effective Use of Language
Well-defined and Logically Developed Thesis
Creative Topic Development
Relevant, Superior Documentation
Strong Command of the Subject Including Current Points of View
Cogent Synthesis and Conclusions

CONTEST GUIDELINES

- X Undergraduates (or instructor with the consent of the student) may submit graded papers to one of the chairpersons of the Departments of Economics, History, Political Science, Psychology, or Sociology-Anthropology.
- X Include two cover sheets: one with student name, paper title and course number (and semester taken) for which paper was originally written; the second with paper title only.
- X Papers may be submitted to departmental chairs any time during the year but must be submitted by February 5, 2009.
- X Chairpersons will submit no more than three papers to the Dean of the College of Sciences by February 13, 2009. The Dean of the College of Sciences presides over the Selection Committee which is composed of a faculty member from each of the participating departments.
