



Prof. Jinhee Lee is historian of twentieth-century Japan and Korea. Dr. Lee received her Ph.D. from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 2004. Her research interests include competing narratives of collective violence, archives and historical knowledge production, women and imperialism, and ethnic conflict.

Dr. Lee got her interdisciplinary training in linguistics, anthropology, area studies, and history at Hankuk University of Foreign Studies (Seoul, S. Korea), Drexel University (PA), University of Tokyo (Tokyo, Japan), and the University of Illinois. Prior to joining EIU where she serves as Coordinator of Asian Studies and Assistant Professor of History, she has taught East Asian cultures and history at the University of Illinois and Fort Hays State University.

She was recipient of research grants from the Japanese Ministry of Education, Illinois Program for Research in Humanities, Graduate Teaching Award and Graduate Teacher Certificate from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and EIU Outstanding Graduate Faculty Mentor Award, Faculty Development Grant, Redden Grants for Undergraduate Instruction.
