Jinhee Lee is assistant professor of history and coordinator of Asian Studies minor. She has written and translated a booklet, book chapters, articles, book/film reviews, and exhibition brochures in Japanese, Korean, and English. Her research focuses on colonialism and imperialism in historical perspective, historical knowledge production, and critical globalism. Her current book project, entitled "Instability of Empire: Earthquake, Rumors, and the Massacre of Koreans in Imperial Japan," focuses on colonial representation, collective violence, and the nervous quality of the multiethnic empire in early twentieth-century Japan. Dr. Lee got her inter-disciplinary training in linguistics, anthropology, area studies, and history at Hankuk University of Foreign Studies (Seoul, S. Korea), Drexel University (PA), University of Tokyo (Tokyo, Japan), and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. Prior to joining EIU, she has taught Asian history and cultures and modern world history at the University of Illinois and Fort Hays State University (KS).
