Cost of Services

A "Health Service" student fee is automatically billed per semester through the student's tuition/fees and helps supplement funding for visits to the Health Service. **The fee allows us to provide medical visits at no additional cost for all full, part-time and graduate students, as well as keep our additional service costs very low!**

Typically, the additional cost for service is only \$8.00-\$35.00.

The **Tel-A-Nurse** is a dedicated phone line answered by a staff nurse. The Tel-A-Nurse helps assess a patient’s symptoms to determine the best course of action. Additionally, the Tel-A-Nurse schedules appointments with all medical providers within the various clinics at the Health Service including women’s health, preventative medicine, nursing triage, and primary care.

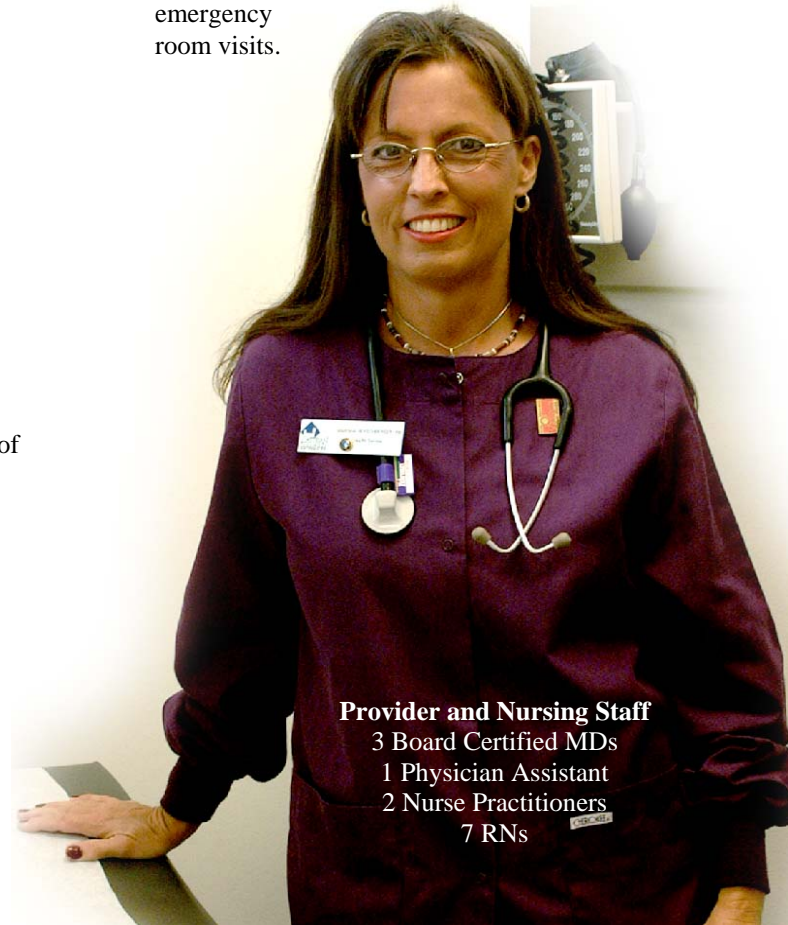
After Hours and Emergencies

If you are in need of emergency or immediate care, during times when the Medical Clinic is closed, please proceed to **Sarah Bush Lincoln Health Center (SBLHC)**.

You may contact Sarah Bush Lincoln Health Center Emergency Room, (217) 348-2551, prior to a visit unless telephoning delays an urgent departure.

Follow-up from ER

For your continuing care, please request that SBLHC forward your medical records to the EIU Medical Provider you typically visit at the Health Service. The Health Service typically provides the follow-up care from emergency room visits.

EIU Pharmacy

The use of the pharmacy provides students with medications prescribed by Health Service providers, private physicians or dentists, if the medication is available on the Health Service formulary, at a minimal fee.

OTC Medications

The EIU pharmacy carries a variety of over the counter medications. Ask your medical provider or nurse for recommendations or speak to the pharmacist to select the right choice for your medical symptoms.

Other Personal Items

Other items available at the EIU Pharmacy include hand gel, emergency contraception (18 and over), lip balm, assortment of condoms, pregnancy tests, first aid supplies, and more.

Payment Options

The EIU Pharmacy accepts cash, personal checks or charges can be billed to the student’s account.

Immunization Policy

All incoming students are required by Illinois Law, Public Act 85-1315 to provide proof of immunization by:

- August 1st for new Fall students
- December 15th for new Spring students

Proof of immunization is required for:

- diphtheria/tetanus (DT)
- measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR)

Immunization records MUST be signed and dated by a health care provider.

These are the same immunization requirements for high school. Immunization records from the student’s high school or primary care provider may be mailed or faxed to the Medical Clinic.

Health Education Resource Center (HERC)

The HERC is dedicated to preventing and reducing preventable health risks and illnesses that interfere with the great opportunities here at EIU. Through the HERC we offer a wide variety of health education and promotion programming, pertinent to college students, related to:

- alcohol and other drugs
- sexual health
- nutrition
- financial health/budgeting
- cold/flu prevention
- sleep
- tobacco use
- variety of other health topics

Programs and services are provided through individual, small group, community and environmental applications.

Confidentiality

All medical records are the property of Health Service and are confidential, according to FERPA. Students medical records will not be shared with anyone, whether University officials or parents, without written permission from the student or as permitted by FERPA. Exceptions under FERPA include, but are not limited to, cases related to public health matters when public health authorities require certain reports on contagion and matters related to health and safety emergencies.
