he presented a paper on "American Organized Labor and the Postwar Defense Establishment," to the Conference of Army Historians. In October, he delivered a paper, "Encountering South Vietnamese Organized Labor: The AFL-CIO and the Vietnamese Confederation of Labor, 1947-1975," at the Meeting of Social Science History Association.

Bailey Young translated various archaeological papers from French into English for publication, for the International Conference of Medieval Studies at Kalamazoo in May 2002, and for the Meeting of the Archaeological Institute of America in New Orleans in January, where he also organized a colloquium on Identity, Space, and Funerary Practice in Iron Age and Early Medieval Europe. His own publications include: D. Verzwymelen and B.K. Young, "Recherches sur le site du château de Walhain," in *Wavriensia*, Tome LI, 3, 2002; several reviews in *Speculum*, *H-Albion*, *The Medieval Review* (online); and forthcoming articles on Merovingian Franks, Tomb of Childeric, and Merovingian Archaeology in the *Encyclopedia of the Barbarian World*; and the paper "Rites funéraires stratégie politique: les cas destombes royales," delivered at the Bibracte Colloquium on Funerary Archaeology (2001), and "Rituel funéraire, structure sociale, choix ideologique et la genèse du faciès funéraire mérovingien" delivered at the Longroy Colloquium (1999)—both Acts to be published 2003. He will engage in a research trip, partly funded by a Ballenger Grant, to Louvain-la-Neuve Belgium in July 2003, in conjunction with the Summer Archaeology Program in Belgium at the Walhain excavation in July 2003. He participated in a presentation on the Luttrell Psalter in the Booth Library Lecture Series, in April.

Professor Emeritus **David Maurer** continues his consulting work with museums, the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency and the Illinois Museums Grants Peer Review Panel. He and wife, Joyce, also enjoyed a 34 day Elderhostel trip to Australia in 2002.

Terry A. Barnhart had an active year in teaching, research, and professional service. The University of Nebraska Press awarded Dr. Barnhart a book contract for his manuscript entitled *Ephraim George Squier and the Development of American Anthropology* for their Critical Histories of American Anthropology Series. His paper "'A Common Feeling': Regional Identity in the Old Northwest, 1820-1860" will appear Spring 2003 in the *Michigan Historical Review*. Dr. Barnhart contributed book reviews to *Isis*, *Ohio History*, *Annals of Iowa*, and the *Journal of the Illinois State Historical Society*. His essay on "Material Culture and Art: An Historical Perspective" appears in *Extraordinary Things: A Study of Contemporary Art Through Material Culture* (University Art Gallery at Indiana State University, 2002), and he conducted a workshop at the History Department's annual History Teachers Conference on "A Sense of Place: Strategies for Integrating State and Local History Within the U.S. History Curriculum." He received nomination for election to a four-year term on the Governing Council of the American Association for State and Local History, and was appointed to a two-year term on the Advisory Board of the Illinois State Historical Society.

Roger Beck received a Personal Merit Increase in Spring 2002 for his contributions to the profession. He reviewed several works on imperialism, travel, and decolonization. He also attended the World History Association annual conference in Seoul, South Korea in August 2002, where he chaired two panels. "Religion and Foreign Impacts" and "Asia and Spirituality in History." He continues to serve actively as the Treasurer of the World History Association.

Ian Binnington taught several United States history courses—Constitutional, Modern United States, and the Civil War and Reconstruction—in his first year at Eastern. In January the American Historical Association's *Perspectives*
