





• Whether the clerk is asking for identification prior to the sale.


• Whether the clerk is accepting identification of a type acceptable under the law or ordinance.




Underage Volunteer Criteria

- Parental / Legal Guardian Consent







The group will observe volunteers and provide an opinion that they believe the volunteers appear to be either over or under the age of 21


This proactive approach engages the community leaders and continues to demonstrate that your compliance check process is both reasonable and fair.























- · Have a plan in place to deal with a vendor that demands to see the volunteer or if the clerk seizes the underage buyers identification.
