During the Spring of 2010, many colleges and university's across Illinois participated in the CORE Alcohol and Other Drug Survey. The “Using SPSS To Get The Most Out Of Your CORE Data” training is to help you better understand the SPSS data that you received from the CORE Institute. Using their 2010 CORE Datafile, participants will learn to open their datafile into SPSS, understand the basic features of SPSS, code and recode SPSS data, use SPSS to run frequencies and descriptive statistics, and use SPSS to run some commonly used inferential statistics (chi-square analyses, t-tests, anovas, and correlations).

Attendees will need a copy of their 2010 CORE Datafile. Prior introductory statistics knowledge is helpful.

This training is limited to 10 participants due to limited space in the computer lab. Each participant will receive a FREE book, “SPSS for Windows.”
