How to Prevent Teen Dating Violence

First year college students are among the population affected by teen dating violence. People that are survivors of teen dating violence are more likely to participate in risky activities like drug and alcohol use. Universities have opportunities to help teach prevention tactics to younger college students. Some of these evidence-based interventions include:

- ★ Teaching healthy relationship skills
- ★ Creating protective environments
- ★ Promoting social norms that protect against violence

The perpetration of violence can be decreased from interventions that use a singular or combined approach. With teen dating violence, universities have the unique opportunity to provide resources and prevention materials to college students. For this population, it is important to educate them on the signs of dating violence, how to prevent it, and how to support others.
