

MENTAL WELLNESS MONTH

Substance Use Disorder (SUD) and mental illness often overlap. There is a high rate of SUD with anxiety disorder, post-traumatic stress disorder, depression, and bipolar disorder.



This graph shows the overlap between serious mental illness (SMI) and substance use. This can be due to genetic vulnerabilities, epigenetic influences, brain region involvement, environmental influences, stress, and trauma. Mental illness can contribute to the development of SUD, and vice versa.

As health and prevention professionals, it is important to recognize the overlap between mental wellness and SUD in order to effectively treat individuals.

SAMHSA RELEASES 2021 NATIONAL SURVEY OF DRUG USE AND HEALTH (NSDUH) DATA

Key findings relating to the typical college age population included:

- Nearly 2 in 5 young adults aged 18 to 25 used illicit drugs within the past year
- Young adults aged 18 to 25 had the highest percentage of substance use disorder (including alcohol and/or other drug use) compared to youth and adults 26 and older within the past year
- In young adults aged 18 to 25, 13.5% had both a substance use disorder and a mental illness
