Description: This course is designed to provide an introduction to the structure and function of the bodily systems, particularly the musculoskeletal system that are essential in the production and/or support of human movement.

Objectives:

1. To learn the structural framework of the human body including bones, joints and muscles.
2. To apply basic anatomical and physical principles to exercise and sport related activities.
3. To be able to identify and demonstrate various fundamental movement patterns and the various planes and axes that define human movement.

Introduction to movement systems and basic biomechanical principles,
Applied Anatomy: Articulations, Movements, & Musculature of the Upper
Extremity, Lower Extremity, Spinal Column & Thorax
Applications: Analysis of movement, Injuries, Training, etc.
