Course Description

Students will be introduced to the fundamentals of tennis and badminton through lecture, practice drills, and play experiences. Students will also be introduced to various methods of teaching tennis and badminton.

Course Learning Outcomes

Throughout the duration of this course, the student will:

1. Acquire knowledge about the history, etiquette, skill techniques, tactics, and safety related to badminton and tennis
2. Demonstrate knowledge of rules for playing in both activities
3. Demonstrate proper selection, care, and maintenance of equipment
4. Improve individual skills in both sports
5. Demonstrate competence on selected skill assessments
6. Demonstrate proper sportsmanship both on and off the court
7. Successfully analyze selected skills for tennis and badminton

Note: Each student is **required to purchase and bring one new can of pressurized tennis balls** during the first two weeks of the tennis unit.

Attendance: Students are expected to attend class meetings as scheduled. When an absence does occur, the student is responsible for the material covered during the absence. Skills Tests: There will be 4 skill tests in this course: 2 for badminton and 2 for tennis skills. Make-up skills tests will not be permitted for unexcused reasons.

Written Tests: There will be written tests in this class to assess student understanding of badminton and tennis knowledge.

Class Participation: All students are required to participate in class activities. Class participation includes arriving to class on time, participating in warm-up and cool-down, practicing the skills, and staying in the class area until class is dismissed. Excellent attendance/participation record is equal to **25 points**. **You are allowed 1 unexcused absence.** Six unexcused absences constitutes an "F" for the course (two tardies = 1 absence). Every unexcused absence will result 10 point deduction.

Teaching Day: Two students will be allowed to work together to teach for a class period of **40 minutes** (10 min in-class lecture and 30 min activity) covering a topic within the Tennis or Badminton unit.

Written Assignments: There will be various written assignment throughout the semester.

Make up in-class activities (skill test, quizzes etc.) will not be given without a doctor's note/excused absence from the dean.
