



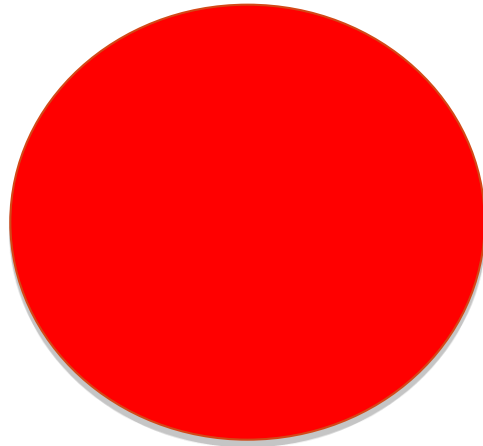

Seven Digit Number

1. In groups search the newspaper for seven different numbers.
2. There must be a one digit number, a two digit number, a three digit number, and so forth all the way up to a seven digit number.
3. Identify the number as to what the number is and where you found it.
4. You must be able to tell the numerical value of the number.

For example: 66 (two digit number). The number is the high temperature. We found it on the weather page and it totals 12.

 2. Identify the who, what, when, where, why, and how.
- Example: President Barack Obama arrives for his State of the Union address before a joint session of Congress Jan. 24, 2012 on Capitol Hill in Washington.
