Admission and Advisement Guidelines
For the Transfer Student
2007-2008

Admission Requirements

1. There is no minimum number of hours required to transfer.
2. A transfer student with 30 semester hours or more must have a “C” average (2.0 out of a 4.0) cumulative from all college credit and at least a “C” average from the last institution attended.
3. A transfer student with 24 semester hours earned must have a 2.5 out of a 4.0 cumulative from all college credit and at least a “C” average from the last institution attended.
4. A transfer student with less than 30 semester hours with a 2.0/4.0 or less than the 24 hours with a 2.5/4.0 must meet the college requirement of a “C” average from the last institution attended and they must also meet one of the following criteria:
 - ACT 18 AND High School GPA of 3.0 or class rank in the upper fourth; or
 - ACT 19 AND High School GPA of 2.5 or class rank in the upper half; or
 - ACT 22 AND High School GPA of 2.25 or class rank in the upper three fourths.

Transfer Agreements

1. A transfer student who is transferring to Eastern with an Associate in Arts (AA), Associate in Science (AS), or an Associate in Science and Art (ASA) degree from an Illinois public community college, Lincoln College, or Springfield College are guaranteed at least 60 semester hours in transfer credit, junior status, and all lower division general education requirements met.
2. Eastern is a participant in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI), a statewide agreement that allows transfer of the completed Illinois General Education Core Curriculum between participating institutions. Transfer students who complete the 37 to 41 semester-hour package of the IAI from any participating college or university in Illinois will be guaranteed all lower division EIU general education requirements completed, the cultural diversity requirement will be met unless seeking a teaching certificate, and the Constitution course will not be required unless seeking a teaching certificate. Acceptance of Credit

1. Eastern accepts all college credit from regionally accredited institutions with the exception of courses that are remedial, developmental, or orientation in nature.
2. Eastern accepts CLEP and/or CEEB Advanced Placement credit provided official test scores are sent and meet Eastern’s standards as set by the appropriate department. All scores need to be sent from the testing agency to the EIU Records Office.
3. There is no maximum number of hours that can be accepted; however, the following graduation requirements must be completed:
 - a. 120 semester hours with all general education and major requirements completed;
 - b. 40 semester hours of upper division (junior/senior level) courses;
 - c. 42 semester hours taken in Eastern (may include off-campus courses taught by EIU faculty); and
 - d. 56 semester hours at a Senior Level (4-year) Institution.

Optional Catalog

An undergraduate transfer student may choose to graduate under the requirements stated in the EIU catalog at the time he/she initially enrolled at another college provided that catalog does not precede his/her enrollment at EIU by more than three years.

EIU General Education

LANGUAGE: 9 semester hours

The requirement is three courses: two in reading and writing and one in listening and speaking. These courses are graded “A”, “B”, “C”, “N/C” (no credit). These courses will only be accepted if they were completed with a “C” or higher.

MATHEMATICS: 3 semester hours

Please see the substitution list for appropriate Gen Ed math courses.

SCIENTIFIC AWARENESS: 7-8 semester hours

The requirement is at least one course in the biological sciences and one in the physical sciences. At least one course must have a lab.

HUMANITIES & FINE ARTS: 9 semester hours

The student must successfully complete at least one course from humanities, one from fine arts, and one course from either humanities or fine arts.

SOCIAL & BEHAVIORAL SCIENCE: 9 semester hours

Two of the three courses must be from different disciplines. An American Government/Constitution course is required for students in Education.

SENIOR SEMINAR: 3 semester hours

To be completed after transfer to Eastern.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE: 0-8 semester hours

The requirement is the completion of the second course in the elementary sequence: 1102G. Students are exempt if they have 2 years of high school with “C” average.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY: 3 semester hours

Students are required to complete a culturally diverse course within one of their general education groupings. These courses can fulfill both the culturally diverse requirement as well as a requirement for another general education area. A culturally diverse course is not needed if IAI or AA/AS/ASA is completed prior to transfer unless the student is an education major.

WRITING COMPETENCY:

All students are required to participate in an Electronic Writing Portfolio made up of essays submitted in writing intensive courses.

- a. 3 essays are required of all students regardless of number of hours transferred.
- b. Essay can be from any course taken at EIU.
- c. Transfer Students are encouraged to submit at least one essay their first semester at EIU.

Associate Degree Benefits

Transfer students who receive an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, or Associate in Science and Arts degree from an Illinois public community college, Lincoln College, or Springfield College in Illinois will be guaranteed the following:

- A minimum of 60 semester hours in transfer credit;
- Junior status;
- All lower division EIU general education requirements are automatically waived; and
- The cultural diversity requirement and the constitution requirements are automatically waived (unless pursuing teaching certificate).

*Students who transfer to Eastern without an AA, AS, ASA degree or the IAI GECC will have their transfer credit evaluated on a course by course basis. Courses will be placed into the comparable general education and major requirements listed in the EIU catalog the student chooses.

*Students will still, however, have to meet the foreign language requirement if they are not exempt with high school work. (Foreign language is a graduation requirement)

TEACHER EDUCATION SELECTION TIPS

(It is recommended that these requirements be completed at least the semester prior to attending EIU)

1. Formal Application to Teacher Education

- Admission to Teacher Education meetings are held each semester.
- Students are encouraged to attend prior to enrollment at EIU or within the first 30 days of enrollment.
- Check website for dates and additional information: www.eiu.edu/ceps/teached

2. Complete at least 29 Semester Hours

- These hours can be represented by transfer credit.

3. Minimum Cumulative GPA of 2.65/4.0*

- Transfer GPA can be used for selection prior to initial enrollment or within the first 30 days of enrollment provided passing scores have been achieved on the Basic Skills Test.
- All other admission to teacher education requirements must be met.
- EIU GPA will be used after initial 30 days of enrollment at EIU.
- **Transfer students must establish and maintain 2.65 GPA at EIU**

4. Passing Scores on the Illinois Basic Skills Test*

- Three main areas: Reading, Language Arts, and Math
- Test **must** be taken before enrollment at Eastern.
(Delay in Selection if not passed before enrollment)
- Take within freshman/sophomore year in College
(first 30 semester hours)
- Must provide a copy of official score report to EIU.
- **Cost is \$85.00** (\$30.00 additional late Registration Fee)
- Registration, Test Site, and Study Guide information at

5. “C” or Better in ENG 1001G, ENG 1002G, and CMN 1310G

- Transfer substitutions can be used.
- If a “D” was earned in English or Speech, course must be repeated.

6. “C” or Better in College Level Math

- IAI General Education Mathematics course will meet this requirement.
- Elementary Education requires MAT 1420 and MAT 2420G.

7. “C” or Better in One of the Following Introduction Course

- ELE/MLE 2000 or ELE 2321 for Elementary Education.
- SPE 3201 or SPE 3225 for Special Education.
- SED 2000 for Secondary Education
- PED 2000 for Physical Education
- MUS 2440 for Music Education.
- CTE 2000 for Career and Technical Education (SED 2000 combined with CTE 2001 can be substituted).

8. Submit Letter of Intent to Office of the Dean, College of Edu. & Prof. Studies

(submitted through LiveText)

9. Complete other requirements

- Have Speech & Hearing Tested at EIU Clinic. Call 217-581-2712 for an appointment (\$5.00 fee).
- Complete the first required Criminal Background Investigation (\$18 fee).
- Document successful completion of the Technology Proficiency.

Admission to the CDS Major:

Students entering EIU as Freshman or Transfers seeking a CDS degree will be classified as probational CDS majors. Probational majors may register for all lower division (2999 or lower) courses in the CDS major.

Access to all upper division CDS courses requires admission to the CDS Major. The Department Chair reviews the applications of all probational CDS majors seeking admission to the major. The chair determines if the student’s academic achievement supports admission to the major and access to upper division course.

Criteria for Admission:

- **Admission to the University**
- **Classification as a probational CDS major**
- **Achievement of a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher for all EIU course work**
- **For Transfer Students, completion of at least 15 semester hours of course work at EIU**

This cooperative degree program, administered by the Pre-Engineering Studies Committee, requires about three years of work at EIU followed by two years of work at either the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (UIUC) or Southern Illinois University at Carbondale (SIUC). It is designed to provide engineering students with a broader base of liberal arts that is usually given in a four-year curriculum. Upon completion of the program, the student receives a Bachelor of Science degree from EIU and a Bachelor of Science in Engineering degree from UIUC or SIUC. Interested students should consult with the Chairperson of the Pre-Engineering Studies Committee for detailed requirements of the program.

Pre-Engineering Program

*This is just a **suggested** course pattern. Students must work with their advisor to develop a curriculum plan that meets their scheduling needs. Summer classes can also reduce the load during Fall and Spring semesters.*

This two-year program is administered by the Pre-Engineering Studies Committee. Students planning to enroll in pre-engineering are advised to include the following in their high school programs: mathematics—four or more units, including Trigonometry; and Science—three or more units, including chemistry and physics. Students with deficient high school background should expect their graduation with an engineering degree to be delayed.

There are two pre-engineering options: general (appropriate for all except chemical engineering) and chemical. Students interested in the chemical engineering option should consult with the chairperson of the Pre- Engineering Studies Committee. The minimum general pre-engineering requirements are as follows:

Pre-Dentistry Program

This program is administered by the Medical Professions Committee. The following meets the minimum course requirements for admission to most dental schools. Pre-dental students are urged to complete at least three years of college work before applying for admission to dental school. It is recommended that the minimum program be enriched with electives in social and behavioral sciences, humanities, and fine arts. Suggested courses in the sciences include biochemistry, microbiology, genetics, physiology, and psychology. All applicants for dental school are required to take the dental admission test (D.A.T.) given by the American Dental Association.

Pre-Law Program and Minor

To provide students with guidance in the selection of those courses which will enable them to complete a J.D. at an American Bar Association accredited law school, EIU offers a minor in Pre-Law Studies. This minor will provide students with the following: basic analytical skills, an introduction to the language of the law, and the written communication skills necessary for the study of law. This minor is administered by the Pre-Law Advisor and the Pre-Legal Studies Committee.

All students interested in a career in law should consult with the Pre-Law Advisor (217) 581-2523 (Coleman Hall 2135) for information regarding law school admission requirements.

Students at Eastern are provided with a variety of on-campus services by the Pre-Law Advisor and the Pre-Legal Studies Committee, including information about all the ABA-approved law schools, guest presentations by law school admissions officers and by person who practice law, several scholarships for students who are admitted to law school, field trips to area law schools, Pre-Law

Internships, a Pre-Law Club, the Law School Admission Test (administered on campus), a mock Law School Admission Test, LSAT Preparatory Course and advice from the Pre-Law Advisor concerning law school admissions strategies.

Pre-Medicine

Since medical schools admit few, if any, students without a bachelor's degree, most students desiring the M.D. degree complete a Bachelor's degree before entering medical school. Programs leading to the BA or the BS degree with a variety of majors are suitable although most students select a major in biological sciences or chemistry. When registering, such students should indicate their choice of degree and major, and declare Pre-Medicine as a second major. All students interested in a career in medicine should consult with the Chairperson, Medical Professions Committee, for information regarding medical school admission requirements.

Students apply through a central application service one full year before matriculating to a medical school, and should be prepared to take the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT) during the spring semester of the year in which they are applying; the following minimum requirements should be met by that time.

Early Childhood Special Education and Early Childhood Education:

Any student desiring dual endorsements on a State of Illinois Early Childhood certificate may do so by supplementing the Early Childhood Handicapped Option with the aid of an academic advisor in the Department of Special Education. In order to do so, the student will be required to complete a few additional course requirements in the area of Early Childhood Education.

Special Education and Elementary Education:

Any student desiring to earn the Elementary (K-9 Illinois) certificate in addition to the Standard Special (K-12 Illinois) certificate may do so by supplementing the Standard Special option with the aid of an academic advisor in the Department of Special Education. Students will be required to complete some additional Elementary Education course work and a 15 semester hour concentration area from English, Fine Arts, Foreign Language, General Science, Mathematics, or Social Science (6 of those hours must be upper-division).

Special Education and Secondary Education:

Any student desiring to earn the High School (6-12 Illinois) certificate in addition to the Standard Special (K-12 Illinois) certificate may do so by supplementing the Standard Special option with the aid of an academic advisor in the Department of Special Education. In order to do so, students will not be required to take ELE 2000, ELE 2320, or a couple of upper division courses listed in the program. They will, however, be required to complete 32 semester hours in an Academic area such as: Art, Health Studies, Math, Music Education, Spanish, Career and Technical Education, Business Education, Family and Consumer Sciences, or Technology Education.
