B. New Degree Program – M.S. in Biochemistry and Biotechnology

Provost Blair Lord requests the Board of Trustees' approval to offer the M.S. in Biochemistry and Biotechnology, effective Spring 2016 Semester (contingent upon IBHE approval).

The M.S. in Biochemistry and Biotechnology is an advanced, interdisciplinary program for students interested in pursuing a career in Biochemistry and Biotechnology. Students will gain the skill sets to improve products and services through molecular-biological and analytical techniques while also being trained in the fundamental business strategies to succeed in the fast pacing field of biotechnology and medical services. Graduates from this program will be well prepared to take positions in biotechnology and pharmaceutical industries or pursue advanced degrees especially in the medical sciences. The program size and design facilitates the personal development of students using the combined expertise of faculty from the departments of Biological Sciences and Chemistry. Highly specialized techniques-based courses will train students in the most modern approaches to scientific problem solving while giving them the academic foundations they will need to succeed in the national and global markets. We anticipate that the program will enroll 10 majors in year one and 25 once it is fully implemented; by that point, it will graduate 10 students each year.







E. University Highlights

AROUND CAMPUS

EIU starts first autism transitional program in state. To kick off the new school year, Eastern Illinois University's Autism Center started a transitional program for incoming college students with autism spectrum disorders to help students navigate the college environment. The program, called Students with Autism Transitional Education Program, STEP, is the only one of its kind offered in the state.

Gail Richard, the director of EIU's Autism Center, said the program enhances the collegiate experience for students with autism spectrum disorders by providing assistance to students with the social, daily, and academic skills they need to transition into college. Students with autism spectrum disorders have difficulties with social interaction, verbal, and nonverbal communication and repetitive behaviors.

The STEP program is designed to minimize the challenges faced by these students once they leave home for the first time. "These are usually very bright individuals, yet they need structure and social skills," said Richard, who has worked with children with autism spectrum disorders for more than three decades.

The program breaks down social barriers and gives students an opportunity to succeed by providing students with study tables, support groups, and student mentors. The full story about the program can be found at

EIU's online degree programs have been ranked among the best online colleges in state. EIU has been ranked on two different lists as one of the best online colleges for 2015 in Illinois. On the lists, EIU outranks all of its state competitors including Illinois State University, Western Illinois University, and Southern Illinois University-Carbondale. The listings are called the "Most Affordable Online College in Illinois in 2015" and "Best Online Colleges in Illinois for 2015-2016." The rankings compared all schools in Illinois that offer online postsecondary education programs based on value and affordability. EIU currently offers three online college bachelor's degree programs and five hybrid master's degree programs. Hybrid programs require online coursework, but they also require a brief time on campus.

EIU website changed to be mobile-friendly. EIU's website change allows for prospective students to easily navigate the site especially on their mobile app. Ryan Gibson, webmaster and director of web & mobile applications, said with more than 25 percent of EIU's visitors using mobile devices it is important EIU is ready to give those users a good experience on the website. "We have an aggressive plan to move academic departments to a mobile friendly template because our research indicates their sites are the first stop for most prospective students," he said. "Early feedback has been very positive on the new site, but we continue to look at the data and already have a few minor tweaks planned to further increase usability."

EIU faculty laureate advocates laying claim to education. Jeannie Ludlow's self-described "colorful education history" suggests that she could be called the ultimate poster child for claiming an education.

She's certainly the right person to serve as Eastern Illinois University's 2015-16 Faculty Laureate, an honor presented to her by the institution's Council on Academic Affairs. In addition to her duties as a full-time faculty member in the Department of English and as coordinator of the Women's Studies program, Ludlow will spend the coming year as the university's official spokesperson on the importance of a general/liberal education.

FACULTY/STAFF NEWS

Chemistry professor awarded NSF grant. Kraig Wheeler of EIU's Chemistry Department was recently awarded a \$290,000 three-year grant from the National Science Foundation Research in Undergraduate Institutions (NSF-RUI) Department of Materials Research. The grant period runs from Aug. 1, 2015 to July 31, 2018. The project explores how molecular shape impacts the internal organization of crystalline solids. Funding will be used to explore factors that affect the development of advanced materials and to train undergraduate research students in Wheeler's lab. In addition, Wheeler's research group will provide X-ray diffraction services to small colleges and universities across the nation that support rigorous undergraduate research programs.

Davidson awarded \$200,000 grant. Eric Davidson of EIU's Health Service was recently awarded a \$200,000 one-year grant from the Illinois Department of Human Services, Bureau of Positive Youth Development. The grant period runs from July 1, 2015, to June 30, 2016. The project provides training, professional development, technical assistance, and networking opportunities for Illinois Institutions of Higher Education who wish to develop or enhance systems to prevent and reduce alcohol and other drug abuse.

Davidson and Tozer awarded early stage recovery grant.

Eric Davidson and Mike Tozer of EIU Health Service were recently awarded a \$10,000 one-year Early Stage Recovery Grant from Transforming Youth Recovery. The grant will provide EIU with early-stage seed funding to engage in a capacity building approach aimed at building the relationships necessary to better meet the needs of students in substance recovery on campus. Through the grant, EIU would like to offer 12-step groups, social support, and networking opportunities for students in recovery. It is hoped that a recognized student organization for students in substance abuse recovery and their allies will be created by the end of the fall semester.
