Course Objectives: 1. Students will learn and use safe technical theatre practices.

2. Students will attain an understanding of professional technical theatre

practices.

3. Students will understand how technical theatre fits into the overall

theatre dynamic.

Conduct of the Course

1. Lecture/Lab/Demonstration- This class will be taught through lecture, lab and discussion. Each will hold equal value. The students will dictate the environment of the classroom. Discussions on all topics are encouraged in this class. Students must successfully pass the Safety Exam before allowed to work in the shop. Supervised work in the shop is a portion of your grade and these hours must be completed specifically for this class. We will develop a sign-up sheet and schedule for week-to-week work on Lab Hours.

- 2.Attendance- Attendance at all class meetings is expected. Three unexcused absences will be permitted. Tests missed on those days cannot be made up (unless the instructor has prior notification). Absences for approved University events and serious illness are excused. In addition, the student will lose 100 POINTS PER ABSENCE over the allotted number(3). Class begins promptly at 9:00am. Students not in class at 9:00am will be considered tardy. Three tardies will be counted as an unexcused absence. Students are required to see all departmental productions. A student ticket is \$5.00.

Assignments

- 1. Reaction Papers- Students are required to see all departmental productions. A critique on the design and technical aspects of the production will be due the Monday after it closes. Critique must be at least 2 full pages.
- 2. Technical Theatre Articles- Four articles from the Theatre Arts section of the New York Times and/or Stage Directions Magazine must be chosen throughout the semester. A one-page discussion must be turned in with the article. The paper must focus on the technical aspects of the article.
- 3. Artist's Statement- Create a 2-page statement explaining what being a theatre artist means to you. Include experiences from your past and how this class can further your journey as an artist.
- 4. Home Depot Field Trip- There will be a group project at Home Depot this semester. Date and time TBD.
- 5. TD Project- a group project involving the planning of a theoretical production.
- 6. Research Paper- This will be a 5-page research paper on some aspect of stagecraft or design. Topics should be chosen by midterm and approved by the instructor.
- 7. Wooden Box Project- Students will build a small wooden box, created from a set of draftings.
- 8. Foam Project- a 1' x 1' carved foam tile. Students will be given a line drawing, which they will transfer to the foam. The student will then render a 3-D version of the line drawing.
- 9. Scenic Painting Project- Students will be given a line drawing, which they will scale and transfer to a 4' x 4' flat. Color Theory will be explored in the project as well.
- 10. Reading Quizzes- A short quiz will be taken on D2L prior to the class period in which the reading is due.
- 10. Quizzes- Two quizzes will be given over material covered.
- 11. Exams- there will be a midterm and final exam.
- 12. Lab Hours- Students are required to spend 30 hours over the course of the term working on departmental productions in the scene shop. It is not enough to show up and record your time, an effort must be put forth to further the current scene shop project, if credit is to be given for each hour earned. This will promote your growth as an artist.

Grading

- 1. Most projects will have a Presentation Day, where feedback on the work will be given by the class and instructor. This will allow improvements to be made prior to the due date. Late projects will reduced one letter grade and cannot be raised by resubmitting. No assignment will be accepted over a week late.
- 2.Projects will be critiqued and discussed in class. We will work through each phase of a project throughout the semester and portions of a project will be presented prior to the final due date for the project. This is designed to help you keep up with the work throughout the semester. The project discussions will be part of your grade on each project.
- 3. Students are graded based on their ability to complete each assignment, their growth during the project, on craftsmanship, and on the merit of the design. A project that fulfills the requirements set forth by the instructor will be guaranteed a passing grade. A project that shows growth in craftsmanship or the artistry of design will merit a better grade.
