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**Course Description:** Examination and analysis of how the essential management functions of PLANNING, ORGANIZING, LEADING, and CONTROLLING are applied in the sport industry.

- a. Comprehend generally accepted principles of organization and administration commonly used by sport managers
- **b.** Analyze concepts and theories related to the core management functions of planning, organizing, leading and controlling fundamental to the successful administration of sport programs.
- c. Examine how the four core management functions apply to event and facility management
