# 1) 'Strategic Facility Plan' for EIU Athletics

(\*Upload to D2L dropbox by Feb 14<sup>th</sup>)

Step #1: Review the EIU Athletics Blueprint for Success strategic plan (document & video) (\*Note – unrealistic \$150+ million plan from 2010) \*Key Question\*: What singular facility investment will provide the greatest long-term return (R.O.I.) for EIU athletics teams and student-athletes? Step #2: Based on state of current facilities, program needs, future goals, and funding limitations, create a strategic facility plan for EIU athletics. Step #3: \* Format Requirements: = MS word doc., title page, section headings, Refs page w/10+ references, upload to D2L by deadline. \*Include needs assessment for EIU Athletics, facility feasibility study (including SWOT analysis), financial prospectus (specific sources of revenue for project - Review Chap 12) and computer-designed floor plan. Cite at least 2 other recent facility projects comparable to your proposed project. \* APA in-text citations & APA-formatted reference page required.

EIU writing rubric will be used to evaluate 5 key components (14 pts each) = Content, Organization, Style, Mechanics, APA Referencing

\* Class text & EIU 'Blueprint' can be used as references. \*Review AB's Facilities of Merit & Ratio Architects projects for proposal ideas.

#### 2) Facility Management Research Presentation (groups of 2) (30 points = oral rubric, 30 points = PPT elements) 60 points

Step #1: Reserve one of the research presentation topics listed on page 2 of the syllabus (\*rank & email me your top 3 topics ASAP)

Step #2: Prepare a comprehensive, interactive, multimedia-enhanced presentation on the facility research topic

Step #3: Upload finalized PPT file to D2L dropbox by the start of class on the presentation due date.

Step #4: \* Minimum PPT Criteria: 20+ content slides, 3+ case studies (examples), 5+ disc Qs, 2 media clips (3-5 min), create 1 data table, create 1 graph for data, 5+ images, 10+ references (\*at least 1 from a research journal), in-slide referencing, "References" slide

### 3) 60-Second EIU Facility Marketing Video

Step #1: Select an EIU campus facility - research its history and dimensions/specifications, evaluate it strengths and current/potential uses Step #2: Create a 10+ photo (+10 captions) slideshow with optimistic music/audio and 5+ slide transitions to effectively market and promote the facility's strengths, functionality, and amenities to the public. Captions should include supportive data to enhance venue perception. Step #3: \*Publish to YouTube - submit link to D2L drop box. Finished product should be professional enough to upload/link on EIU website. \* Variables assessed – timing, image resolution, caption content, slide transitions, smoothness of start/finish.

- #3 What is 'green facility' management' How do 'sustainability initiatives' apply to the design, construction, and operation of sport facilities?
- #4 Is hosting a global sporting event a wise financial investment for a city or country? (ex hosting the World Cup and/or the Olympic Games)
- #5 What is the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA)? Requirements for Sport Facilities? Reasonable Accommodation? Analyze 3 ADA lawsuits.
- #6 Compare strategic security planning for 'venue-based' (ie-NFL) vs. 'open-course' (ie-NYC marathon or PGA tour event) events?
