


Visual




Visual Learners make up about 65% of the population.




Visual Learners:

- Learn best by sight
- Maps, charts, tables, and diagrams aid in understanding and retention of information, ideas, & concepts.



Study Tips for Visual Learners:

- Make color coded note cards for information you need to remember.
- Take thorough notes in class or while reading, to use as a study aid prior to exams.
- Create outlines for different topics covered in class.
- Create your own visual aids from material covered in class.



Kinesthetic (Tactile)





Kinesthetic (Tactile) Learners make up about 5% of the population.

Kinesthetic (Tactile) Learners:

- Learn best through hands-on activities
- Learn best when physically engaged in the classroom

Study Tips for Kinesthetic (Tactile) Learners

- Copy notes repeatedly.
 - (Repetitive writing serves as memory aid.)
- Use a stress ball or fidget
- Study in short intervals.
 - (Take breaks & get up)
- Listen to soft music while studying
- Physically practice concepts you are studying



Auditory



Auditory Learners make up about 30% of the population.

Auditory Learners:

- Process information best through listening.
- Find it easiest to recall information they heard in class.

Study Tips for Auditory Learners:

- Record lectures & replay them while studying.
 - (Be sure to get your instructor or teacher's permission.)
- Make flashcards to review aloud.
- Find a study partner or group
- Repeat information you have memorized aloud with your eyes closed. This eliminates any visual distractions.
