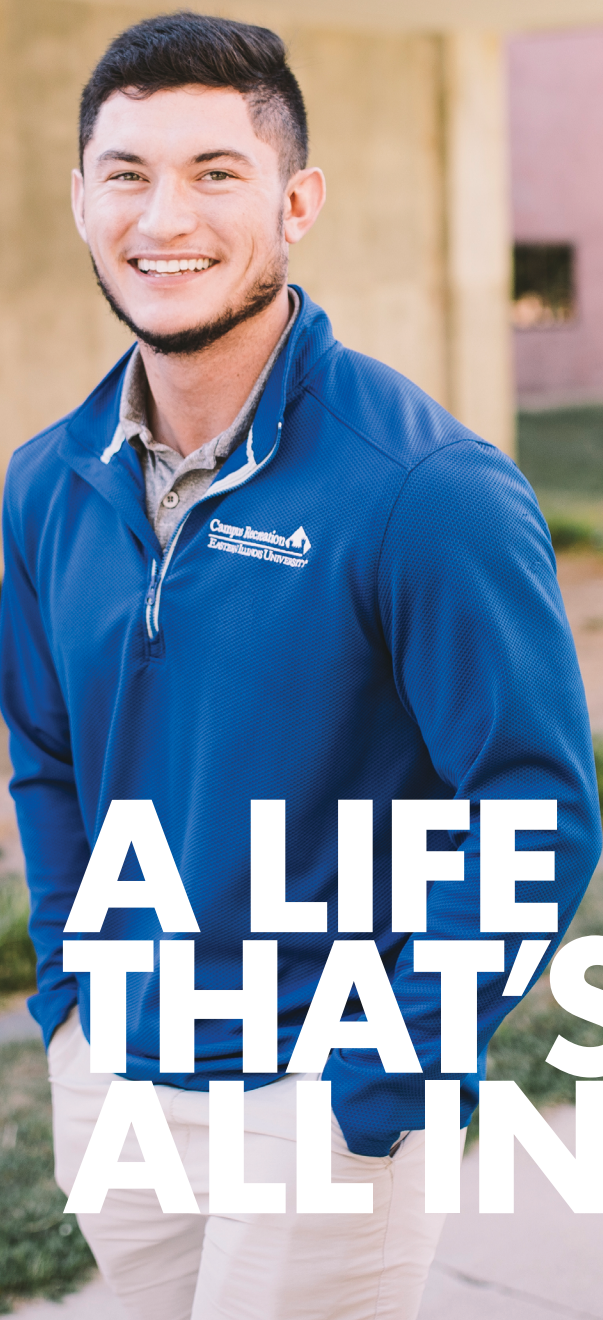

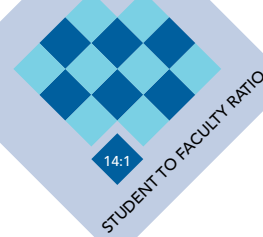

- ◆ Send official high school transcripts

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- ◆ **Test-Optional: 2.8/4.0 GPA**
Students with a GPA between 2.3-2.79 will be reviewed to determine eligibility.
- ◆ **Test-Reported: 2.5/4.0 GPA and 960 SAT or 18 ACT**
Students who do not meet the criteria above may be encouraged to submit additional documents.
