ACADEMY PROVIDES MEMBERS THE OPPORTUNITY TO ENROLL IN EIU CLASSES THROUGH THE ACADEMY PASS



Have you ever told a friend that you "wanted to do something?" Then that friend called you on it?

When Marita Metzke, Program Director of Academy of Lifelong Learning, learned that I had retired she called me and reminded me that I had told her that I wanted to audit a class at Eastern when I had the time. Caught off guard, my thoughts wandered off to all the things I wanted to learn.

One of my failures in life was that I could not play the piano like I wanted to. I have had over 30 years of piano lessons with wonderful teachers, yet never felt like I could play acceptably. I love Classical music and struggled every time I sat down at a piano to play Beethoven, Bach, Schubert, or any of the wonderful classical composers.

I asked Marita if it would be possible to take classical piano at EIU. She said she would check it out for me. When she got back to me, she had all the approvals needed, enrolled me with Dr. Jonathan Bowman in the Music Department, had dates, parking passes, and much encouragement for me to achieve my goal.

Whew, I thought. Now how am I going to handle this?

When I met with Dr. Bowman the first time I told him right up front that I had had years and years of piano yet could not play. He informed me, "You will."

After a semester of taking Dr. Bowman's Classical Music Class I no longer can cay, "I can't play." No excuses with this Professor and no manipulation. I learned about ergonomics of sitting at a piano, finger exercises, counting, techniques, and how to just take "one page at a time" and even breaking that page down to right hand first, left hand, then together, one measure at a time.

I, fortunately, could read notes pretty well, so this helped a lot. Concentration on rhythm was something that I wanted to learn, and we also focused on that. I was a percussionist in high school band and was good at rhythm way back then. Somewhere along life's path, I lost this skill. Today, I can count again.

I am now very comfortable sitting at the piano and I feel very successful in what I have accomplished. I can even play the piano standing or sitting on the floor. Amazing! More amazing is that I am working on learning theory and adding contemporary classical music to my repertoire.

Thank you, Marita and Academy of Lifelong Learning, for giving me an opportunity to succeed in something I had felt such a failure at.



Even before the rise of commercial air travel and ballistic missiles, air brought to mind direct connections with distant parts of the world more readily than land and water did. This presentation will explore several interrelated aspects of the influences of birds and bird migrations upon Illinoisans' geographic and environmental perceptions during the first century of Illinois's statehood.

First, rural Illinoisans paid considerable attention to wild birds, both as sources of food and as allies in the war against insect pests before effective synthetic pesticides. Second, a sense that bird populations were declining due to habitat loss and hunting led to increased efforts to figure out bird migrations. Third, those who worked to understand migration did so through vast collaborative webs. Fourth, ornithological studies drew attention to connections to distant places. Finally, understandings of bird migrations were influenced by politics insofar as birders tended to consider North America north of Mexico as a main unit of study (thereby distorting the ranges of many birds) and tended to displace blame for declining bird populations.




