ALTERED BOOKS

Instructor: Jamie Willis

Students will alter used hard back books with paints, cut outs, simple printmaking, and surface design techniques. Each book will be personal, theme based, and fluid works in progress. Create art within the book format.

Ms. Willis has received the Middle Level Art Educator of the Year and Illinois Art Teacher of the Year awards from the Illinois Art Education Association. She is a Watercolorist and Fiber Artist. She has an BA and MA in art from EIU. She is has taught K - college, and has taught at EIU Summer Art School for many years.

PAINTING

Instructor: Chris Davis

Students will choose to complete either a still life or a grid painting. They can explore still life from the perspective of any art movement, using in-depth analysis that will further hone their understanding of Art History, concepts and techniques utilized in specific movements. Students can learn a basic grid painting process and explore their own response to the process. Students who opt to create a grid painting should bring an appropriate 8" x 10" image of their choice.

Mr. Davis has a BA in Art from Greenville College and an MA in painting and drawing from EIU. His art has been exhibited throughout Illinois and Missouri. He is a prolific painter who has explored numerous painting styles. This is Chris's eighth summer teaching at Summer Art School.



PRINTMAKING

Instructor: Reagan Carev

Students will explore the process of creating multiple monotype prints utilizing oil based black ink, plexiglass, and paper using a manual press. Emphasis will be placed on creating value and texture to create form. Students are encouraged to bring unique photos or xerox copies for reference.

Ms. Carey is an EIU alumnus with an MA in printmaking. She currently serves as the director of Autism and Therapy Programs for CTF Illinois. This is Ms. Carey's third year teaching at Summer Art School.

SCULPTURE

Instructor: Dorothy Bennett

Students will construct a plaster sculpture, incorporating cast body parts (hands, feet, faces) into the finished piece. Body parts will be molded from wax placed on students and then cast in plaster. Then the creative process begins. Just what can be created from cast parts? Let the imaginations run wild.

Ms. Bennett has a BA and MA in sculpture and metalsmithing from EIU, and has taught K - college. She has twice been named Illinois Elementary Art Educator of the Year, received the Distinguished Service to the Profession of Art Education Award, and the President's Award, and the Distinguished Member Award, all from the Illinois Art Education Association. She received the 2008 Distinguished Educator Award fro EIU's Alumni Association. She is an award winning artist who has had her work exhibited throughout the midwest and in a recent international exhibition. Ms Bennett has been teaching at Summer Art School for 22 years, and 2016 marks her 20th as its director.

The Eastern Illinois University Department of Art and the School of Continuing Education are working cooperatively with the Illinois Federation of Women's Clubs to present the 2016 Summer Art School for High School Students.

Applicants will have the opportunity to focus on 3 of 4 areas of concentration during the week-long experience and must indicate their ranked preferences on the registration form. The objective of the Summer Art School is to introduce students to new techniques and help students refine their aesthetic skills.

Participants will be expected to commit themselves to a demanding course of study and development. A variety of recreational activities will also be planned and students will have time to relax, make new friends, and experience campus life

SPECIAL SATURDAY MORNING WORKSHOP

At a Saturday morning workshop students will be introduced to musical sounds and rhythms from around the world as performed by acclaimed percussionist Rocky Maffit. This will be a unique opportunity to participate in a variety of 4^{th} dimensional/time arts activities that are becoming more popular in the art world as exemplified by groups such as Blue Man Crew and Stomp.

ABOUT THE FACULTY AND ART FACILITIES

The faculty of the 2016 Summer Art School consists of professional artists and art educators with well-regarded regional and/or national reputations. The faculty are selected based on their expertise in the specific areas of concentration. Students will utilize college art classrooms, studios, and other related art instructional facilities. Classes will be held in the state-of-the-art Doudna Fine Arts Center. In addition, students will have the opportunity to view and critique original works of art exhibited in the Tarble Arts Center, an art facility featuring traveling exhibitions by nationally known artists.

LOCATION

The Summer Art School is held at Eastern Illinois University in Charleston, Illinois. Charleston is located in East Central Illinois, just off I-57 on Route 16. It is 135 miles from St. Louis, 200 miles from Chicago, and 120 miles from Indianapolis.

CAMP SCHEDULE

Summer Art School will run from July 17-23, 2016. Registration and check-in will be held in the lobby of the assigned residence hall from 2 - 4:30 p.m. on Sunday, July 17. (All participants will receive an acknowledgement letter with directions and a campus map.)

On the last day of the program (Saturday) parents and family members are invited to attend a reception and exhibition showcasing the students' works. Participants will depart after the exhibition.

REGISTRATION FEE

The tuition for the 2016 Summer Art School is \$485, which includes all instruction, six nights lodging, 18 meals in a University residence hall, recreational activities, and a \$50 non-refundable art materials fee. Please enclose with your application a \$50 deposit from you or your sponsor, which will be applied toward your tuition. The application and deposit are due by June 1, 2016. The remaining balance of \$435 is due by June 21, 2016. Enrollment is limited. Apply early to ensure a place in the camp.

CANCELLATION POLICY

If you register and find you cannot attend, a full refund less the \$49 non-refundable art materials fee will be made to you or your sponsor if you cancel by June 14, 2016. Thereafter, an additional cancellation fee of \$50 will be retained.

SCHOLARSHIPS

A variety of civic groups provide scholarships to talented students who might not otherwise attend. Check with your art teacher, counselor, or high school principal to see if any organizations in your community offer such assistance. Students may receive full or partial scholarships for their registration fees. However, students do not need a scholarship to attend. The partnership with the GFWC Illinois Federation of Women's Clubs has resulted in sponsorship of thousands of high school students to the Summer Art Schools since 1948. ACCOMMODATIONS AND MEALS



CAMPUS RULES


