

**Articulation Agreement**  
Between  
**Eastern Illinois University**  
And  
**Joliet Junior College**


Joliet Junior College (JJC) and the Board of Trustees of Eastern Illinois University (EIU) form a cooperative relationship through this articulation agreement to serve better our public constituents, to smooth transfer, to minimize duplication of instruction, and to build on community college and university learning experiences. Both institutions recognize that working together, their collective efforts are stronger than their individual efforts.


The two institutions agree to the following:

1. Any student who has completed a baccalaureate-oriented associates degree at JJC (with the required 2.00 GPA) and submits required application and supporting documentation will automatically be admitted to EIU at the junior level and will be deemed to have met EIU's lower division general education requirement.
2. Acceptance into a specific EIU program is based on the individual transferring student meeting the conditions and considerations listed for that program. Specifically, students completing the **Associates in Science A.S.** at JJC will be admitted to the baccalaureate **Geography B.S.** at EIU.
3. The courses listed in the attached prescribed JJC transfer guide have been reviewed and accepted for transfer to EIU.
4. Relationships between JJC and EIU faculty and administration are in the spirit of cooperation and provide the basis for this agreement.
5. Representatives of both institutions agree to meet on a regular basis to assess curricular changes and other conditions that may affect the nature of this agreement.
6. This agreement does not preclude either institution from making curriculum changes as it may solely deem appropriate in which case appropriate prior notice will be given to the operative academic personnel at the cooperating institution.
7. Appropriate publications and promotional materials regarding this agreement will be made available to all JJC students.
8. Either EIU or JJC may dissolve this agreement by giving one years' advance notice to the cooperating institution's president or academic vice president.
9. This agreement is effective for four years beginning with the **2018-2019** academic year and is subject to renewal every four years.



<sup>3</sup> Apply to Eastern one year prior to enrollment. Have official transcripts sent from college and from high school.

<sup>4</sup> Additional Science credit hours needed for A.S. degree requirements; all electives are to be chosen in consultation with an academic advisor.

<sup>5</sup> Eighteen semester hours in a designated Option is required. Options available in Human and Regional Geography or Environmental and Physical Geography. GEOG 111 Physical Geography – Weather and Climate counts toward the Enviro/Physical Geography. GEOG 102 World Regional counts towards the Human Geography course requirements. See catalog for course offerings.

<sup>6</sup> Course may count towards Non-Option. Must choose 9 semester hours from the course list in the non-designated Option. GEOG 111 Physical Geography – Weather and Climate counts toward the Enviro/Physical Geography. GEOG 102 World Regional counts towards the Human Geography course requirements. See catalog for course offerings.

<sup>7</sup> Nine semester hours of Geography Techniques Electives are required. See catalog for course offerings.

<sup>8</sup> Select from Geography and/or Earth Science Electives chosen in consultation with EIU faculty advisor. Students are encouraged to consider an Internship, Independent Studies and/or research as part of their curriculum (GEO 42751/42851/42951, GEO 44001/44101/44201, GEO 44301/44401/44501).

**Note** Completion of the second semester of a single foreign language is an EIU graduation requirement. Students are exempt if two full years of a high school foreign language are completed with a "C" average or better.
