Articulation Agreement

Eastern Illinois University

Community College District 504

Community College District 504, commonly known as Triton College. (TC) and the Board of Trustees of Eastern Illinois University (EIU) form a cooperative relationship through this articulation agreement (Agreement) to better serve our public constituents, to smooth transfer between institutions, to minimize duplication of instruction, and to build on community college and university learning experiences. Both institutions recognize that working together, their collective efforts are stronger than their individual efforts.

The two institutions agree to the following:

- 1. Any student who has completed a transferable associates degree at TC consistent with the Illinois Articulation Initiative (with the required 2.00 GPA) and submits the required application and supporting documentation will automatically be admitted to EIU at the junior level and will be deemed to have met EIU's lower division general education requirements.
- 2. Acceptance into a specific EIU program is based on the individual transferring student meeting the conditions and considerations listed for that program. Specifically, students completing the Geology A.S. at TC will be admitted to the baccalaureate Geology B.S. at EIU.
- 3. The courses listed in the attached prescribed TC transfer guide has been reviewed and accepted for transfer to EIU. The transfer guide is incorporated by reference herein.
- 4. Relationships between TC and EIU faculty and administration are in the spirit of cooperation and provide the basis for this Agreement, but the employees of one institution shall not be deemed an employee of the other institution as a result of this Agreement.
- 5. Representatives of both institutions agree to meet on a regular basis to assess curricular changes and other conditions that may affect the nature of this Agreement.
- 6. This Agreement does not preclude either institution from making curriculum changes as it may solely deem appropriate, in which case appropriate prior written notice will be given to the operative academic personnel at the cooperating institution. Students previously approved for transfer prior to such changes shall not be obligated to the new curriculum changes.
- 7. Appropriate publications and promotional materials regarding this Agreement will be made available to all TC students here: (https://www.eiu.edu/transfer/agreements).
- 8. Either EIU or TC may dissolve this Agreement by giving one years' advance written notice to the cooperating institution's president or academic vice president. All students participating in a planned transfers pursuant to the terms of this Agreement shall be permitted to complete the academic transfer under the terms and conditions stated herein.
- This Agreement is effective with the 2022-2023 academic year and shall continue for four (4) academic years. The Parties may agree to renewal terms every four years for additional four (4) year terms, or in such duration as may be agreed to by the authorized agent of the Parties.
- 10. Each party agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the other party, its officers, agents, trustees and employees against any losses, damages, judgments, claims, expenses, costs and liabilities imposed upon or incurred by or asserted against the party, its officers, agents, trustees or employees, including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses, arising out of the acts or omissions of the other party, its officers, agents or employees, under this Agreement.
 - Triton College, as an entity and on behalf of its employees, agents, and students, claims any and all governmental immunity as may be established by or set forth under Federal or Illinois law, rule or regulation.
- 11. This Agreement is executed by an authorized representative of each party in the representative's official capacity only and the representative shall have no personal liability under this Agreement.

- 12. Neither party shall discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, age, marital status, physical or mental handicap, an unfavorable discharge from military service, or any other factor as prohibited by law. Each party certifies that it is an equal opportunity employer and maintains a written sexual harassment policy and Drug Free Workplace policy.
- 13. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the substantive laws of the State of Illinois regardless of any conflict of laws provision. All disputes arising out of this Agreement, wherever derived, will be resolved in the Circuit Court of Cook County, Illinois or the Illinois Court of Claims.
