WHY STUDY MUSIC EDUCATION AT EIU:

CUSTOMIZABLE

EIU offers three concentrations:

Instrumental Music, Vocal/Choral Music, and General Music. You can choose the concentration that best meets your interests and teaching goals.

BROAD

When you graduate, you'll be prepared to teach music at all levels, from elementary to high school. You will be able to choose appropriate methods and music, plan course content and activities, and inspire the next generation of music students.

LICENSURE

Upon completion of the program you will have the skills and requirements needed for state licensure and employment as a K-12 music teacher.

INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC:

You'll gain experience in all the traditional wind, brass, string and percussion instruments and learn management skills for a successful band and/or orchestra program.

VOCAL MUSIC:

You'll learn vocal and choral pedagogical skills, techniques for teaching general music, and management skills for a successful vocal music education program.

GENERAL MUSIC:

This concentration is designed to prepare pre-service educators for teaching non-ensemble-oriented classes in the elementary, junior high, and high school levels. All students in this program develop vocal and piano skills, gain experience performing and teaching with a variety of classroom and world percussion instruments, as well as experience incorporating technology, composition and improvisation into their classrooms.
